

Diem Assumes New Post Countries Assigned At Bridgeport University For Spring Week

Albert E. Diem, former vice president for business at the University, assumed duties yesterday as Assistant to President James M. Halsey at the University of Bridgeport, Bridgeport, Conn., University officials announced.

The University of Bridgeport is a coeducational, private, non-sectarian school. It was chartered in 1927 as The Junior College of Connecticut and expanded to a 4-year university in 1947. Last fall it enrolled 3,826 undergraduate and 470 graduate students. Its evening division, including the junior college, enrolled 2,467.

DIEM RESIGNED his post at the University on Jan. 31, 1962. Since 1958, Diem had been the overseer of the business operations of the University.

In this capacity he was in charge of physical plant planning and construction, food and housing services, personnel services and employee relations, maintenance and utilities, purchases, general services, security and management engineering.

President Halsey said that the University of Bridgeport was "delighted" to obtain a man of Diem's stature and explained that Diem would assist him for the next six months in launching the University of Bridgeport's 10-year \$17,500,000 development and expansion program.

tion with reluctance and regret, observing that Diem has "reorganized the business sector of the University in his three years at the helm and at the present time it represents one of the most efficient and most economical operations in the country."

Stanley H. Campbell, then director of housing and food services, has succeeded Diem in the post.

Selective Service

Applications may now be obtained for the Selective Service college qualification test from Mrs. Sara Case in the dean of men's office, 109 Old Main.

The test will be given here April 17. Applications which are sent to the Educational Testing Service in Princeton, N.J., must be postmarked no later than midnight March 27.

The test scores are used to provide Selective Service boards with evidence of the registrant's aptitude for continued college work.

An applicant must be a Selective Service registrant who intends to request deferment from the draft as a student. He must have satisfactory grades in a full-time, graduate or under-graduate college course leading to a degree.

An interim editor was named by the editorial board to head the staff until March 8 because the original editor was placed on conduct probation, which excluded him from extra-curricular activities.

Meanwhile, other college newspapers came to the Pennsylvanian's aid editorially. A telegram signed by seven editors was sent to the president Monday and yesterday copies of Columbia and Lehigh Universities' papers were distributed on Penn's campus.

Halsey said, "Mr. Diem will assume primary responsibility for the business operations of the University."

At the time of Diem's resignation, President Eric A. Walker said he had accepted the resigna-
