

Cologne Group Assigned 'Top' Profs

The 28 students attending the University of Cologne, Germany, next term will study under the "top men in the fields," Dr. Dagobert deLevie, director of the Study Abroad program, said recently.

DeLevie named Dr. Rolf Badenhausen, a former associate of "Germany's most important contemporary producer, director and actor," Gustav Grundgens, as one of the outstanding professors.

BADENHAUSEN will teach a theatre arts history course. He will use an old castle, now converted to a theatrical museum, for a "classroom."

A native of Emden, Germany, Badenhausen holds degrees from the Universities of Berlin and Munich. He taught at Munich before coming to Cologne.

Badenhausen was formerly reader and director of the Museum for Theatre Arts in Berlin and later headed the museum.

Another German professor, Dr.

Erwin K. Scheuch, will teach a sociology course on German society. Scheuch, a former Fulbright scholar at the University of Connecticut, is a graduate of the University of Cologne. Fulbright scholarships are awarded by the United States government to foreign students for study at American universities.

SCHUCH has had many years of experience in the field of social research, both with the United Nations Educational, Social and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in Europe and the Rockefeller foundation in this country. In September, Scheuch will fill a lecture post at Harvard University.

A third German professor to be associated with the Study Abroad program is Dr. Rudolf Wildermann, research associate with the

Research Institute for Political Science at Cologne.

Wildermann will take charge of a political science course including both classroom study and observation of German government at work. He has had "adequate opportunity" to observe his subject, deLevie said, after having served as Bonn correspondent for a liberal-conservative publication.

Wildermann, who holds a doctor of philosophy degree in government, recently directed the largest election study ever undertaken in Germany. Scheuch collaborated with Wildermann on this study.

De LEVIE, associate professor of German here, announced he would teach a course in German language and composition while serving as resident-director for the program.

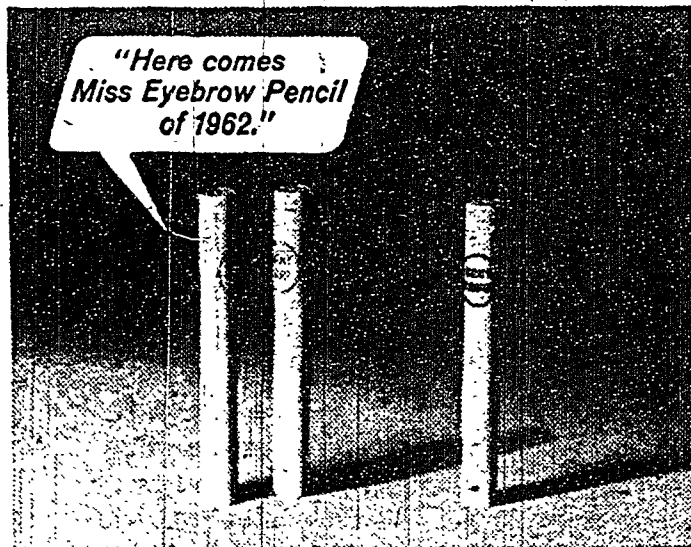
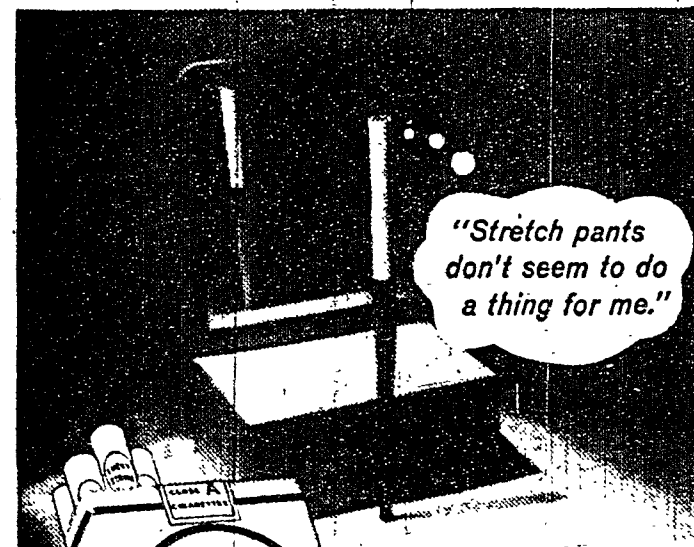
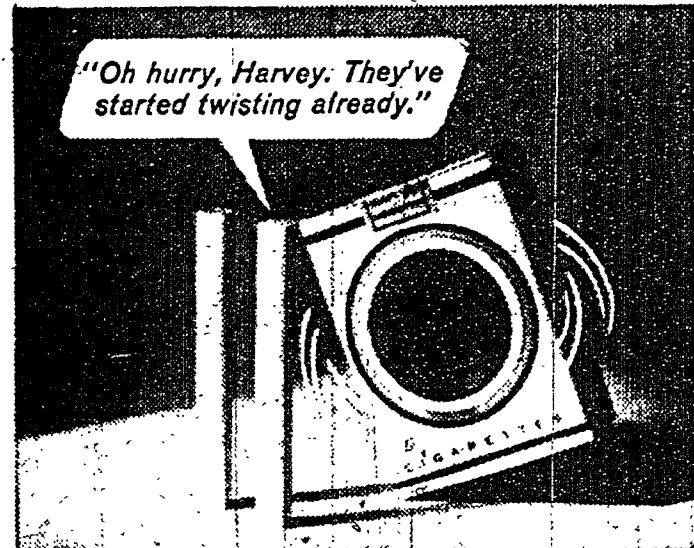
