

31 Home Events for Nittanies

Thirty-one home events are scheduled for Penn State teams this spring.

Ten of the Nittany Lions' 20 baseball games are slated for the home diamond and three of the track squad's four dual meets will be staged here.

The golf team will play seven times on the home course, the tennis team will see action five times here, and lacrosse, under new head coach Dick Pencek, will be at home six times.

COACH JOE BEDENK'S baseball team will open the spring campaign here April 3 against Gettysburg. Other home opponents include Ithaca, Bucknell, Maryland, Navy, Colgate, Syracuse, West Virginia, and Temple.

The track team, which will open its season April 14 at Navy, isn't slated for a home appearance until May 5 against Michigan State. Pittsburgh will be here May 12 and on May 19 the Lions will entertain the Quantico Marines.

In their respective home openers, the lacrosse team will face Lafayette, the golfers will test Colgate, and the tennis team will meet Army.

Grantham Leads Lion Thinclads To Triangular Win at Fort Lee

While most students were home resting during the term break last week, Penn State's track and field team was at Fort Lee, Va., hard at work conditioning for the upcoming outdoor season.

Last Friday State warmed up for its opening meet with Navy April 14, by winning a pre-season outdoor triangular meet at the Army camp. The Lions rolled up 75 points to defeat Virginia State with 45 and Fort Lee with 29.

BOB GRANTHAM led the way with first places in the broad jump, 120-yard high and 220-yard low hurdle events and the hop, step and jump. Howie Deardorff took first places in the mile and 880 runs.

Penn State's veteran mentor Chick Werner did a bit of experimenting in the meet by placing some of his runners in positions they don't ordinarily run. Steve Moorhead, State's best miler, was

clocked in 51.2 seconds for a first place finish in the 440.

Two-miler Gerry Norman placed third in the middle distance 880-yard run, while Dick Tuft and Ted Inswiler, middle distance runners, placed first and second in the two-mile.

Jerry Wettstone, Penn State's high jump record-holder, won his event with a 6'4" leap. John First placed second at 6' in the high jump and also came in second in the discus throw.

MIKE MILLER and Lionel Bassett finished behind Deardorff to make a clean sweep of the mile run. Miller also took a third place in the 220-yard hurdles.

Ciro Risoldi placed first in the pole vault and second in the javelin throw. Dave Brier finished second in the pole vault.

Steve Popp took third places in the 100 and 220-yard dashes and Phil Holmes finished third in the hammer throw and hop, step and jump.

Famous Single Wing Coach Dies

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Brig. Gen. Robert R. Neyland, the single-wing wizard who coached Tennessee's Volunteers to football's heights, died yesterday at the age of 70.

The man who produced some of America's top teams and coaches, in addition to having a distinguished career as an Army engineer, succumbed to the kidney

and liver ailment that in 1953 forced his retirement as an active coach after 21 years.

Neyland's Tennessee teams won 171 games, lost 27 and tied 12 during the 21 seasons he coached. His next-to-last team finished No. 1 in the final Associated Press poll in 1951 and won the national championship. Since 1953, he had held a lifetime post as athletic director.
