Graham Picks Saul for Game With Packers

Bill Saul, a center and line-backer on Penn State's football squad, has been selected by coach Otto Graham to play with the college all-stars against National Football League champion Green Bay in the all-star game at Chicago's Soldiers Field in August. Saul, a senior from Butler, has signed with the Baltimore Colts. Penn State will be the site of five PIAA championship events this spring. The rifle and volleyball finals will be held in Rec Hall April 14. Championships in golf and tennis are slated for May 25-26, with the track championships set for May 28. All football attendance records at Penn State are likely to be topped next fall when the Nittany Lions entertain Navy, Air Force, Syracuse, Maryland, and West Virginia. Penn State led the East in total attendance last fall when more than 193,000 fans packed Beaver Stadium to watch the Lions battle Navy, Army, Syracuse, California, and Holy Cross. Coach Rip Engle will unveil his 1962 edition Sept. 22 in State's home opener against Navy. Air Force will play here a week later. Engle is hobbling around these days on crutches with his leg in a cast — the result of a ruptured Achilles tendon while playing paddle ball in Rec Hall. With spring football drills slated to begin Saturday, Engle will be hard-pressed to keep up with his gridders. He may do it by using a mechanized golf cart. Joe Paterno, the "confirmed" bachelor of State's football coaching staff, at long last has deserted those ranks and in May will marry Suzanne Pohland of Latrobe. She's a State graduate and a sister of Ed Pohland, heavyweight wrestler on the Nittany Lions' mat squad. Paterno coaches the Lions' offensive backfield, and in 12 years at State has produced quarterbacks the likes of Galen Hall, All-American Richie Lucas, Milt Plum, Al Jacks, and Tony Rados.

Dietzel Keeps Door Open For Post Season Games

NEW YORK (AP)—Paul Dietzel, who has been spoiled by a steady bowl diet during his coaching career, is not opposed to a postseason game for Army—under certain circumstances. "First of all, Army people would have to want the game," the new head coach at West Point said Wednesday. "Our team would have to be an outstanding one. And the players themselves would have to be given the right to vote 'yes' or 'no.'" Army traditionally has remained aloof from bowl games but in recent years the resistance has been wavering. Dietzel coached several bowl teams while at Louisiana State University.

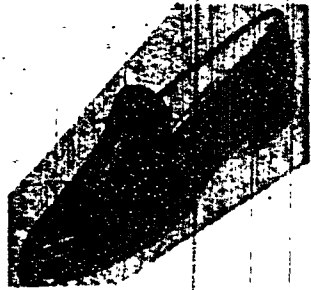
