

Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra To Perform Tonight in Rec Hall

The program to be presented by the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra at 8:30 tonight in Recreation Hall will consist of compositions by Berlioz, Mendelssohn and Bartok.

Over 1,000 student tickets and 400 non-student tickets will be available today at the Hetzel Union desk.

The Overture, "Roman Carnival" by Berlioz will open the Artists' Series program, followed by Mendelssohn's "Symphony No. 3 in A Minor." After intermission, the orchestra will play Bartok's "Concerto for Orchestra."

THE ORCHESTRA, conducted by William Steinberg, places special emphasis on performances for youth and industrial workers. When not on tour, it devotes 37 concerts each year to young audiences.

In addition, it gives an annual Saturday evening concert for teenagers, after which the audience is invited to a coke party with Steinberg and members of the orchestra.

The orchestra performs a series of concerts sponsored by the Manufacturers Light and Heat

Company, in which the audiences are primarily industrial workers. The city of Pittsburgh also sponsors a series of concerts which are free to the public.

Steinberg feels that in conducting these special concerts, the orchestra is "preaching the gospel of music." He also finds that the special events help the orchestra to reach more and more people every year who have a sincere affection for music.

AN ANNUAL SUM of \$300,000 is needed to sustain the orchestra and is raised primarily by volunteer workers in the Pittsburgh area. Ten professional staff members and a 75-member board of directors schedule the program for the orchestra.

In addition, a Women's Association of the Symphony Society assists in projects such as the Tiny Tots Concert Series, the Young Adults Concerts and the annual Symphony Ball.

Delta Sigma Theta sorority is collecting books for World University Service at a table next to the Hetzel Union desk until April 9.

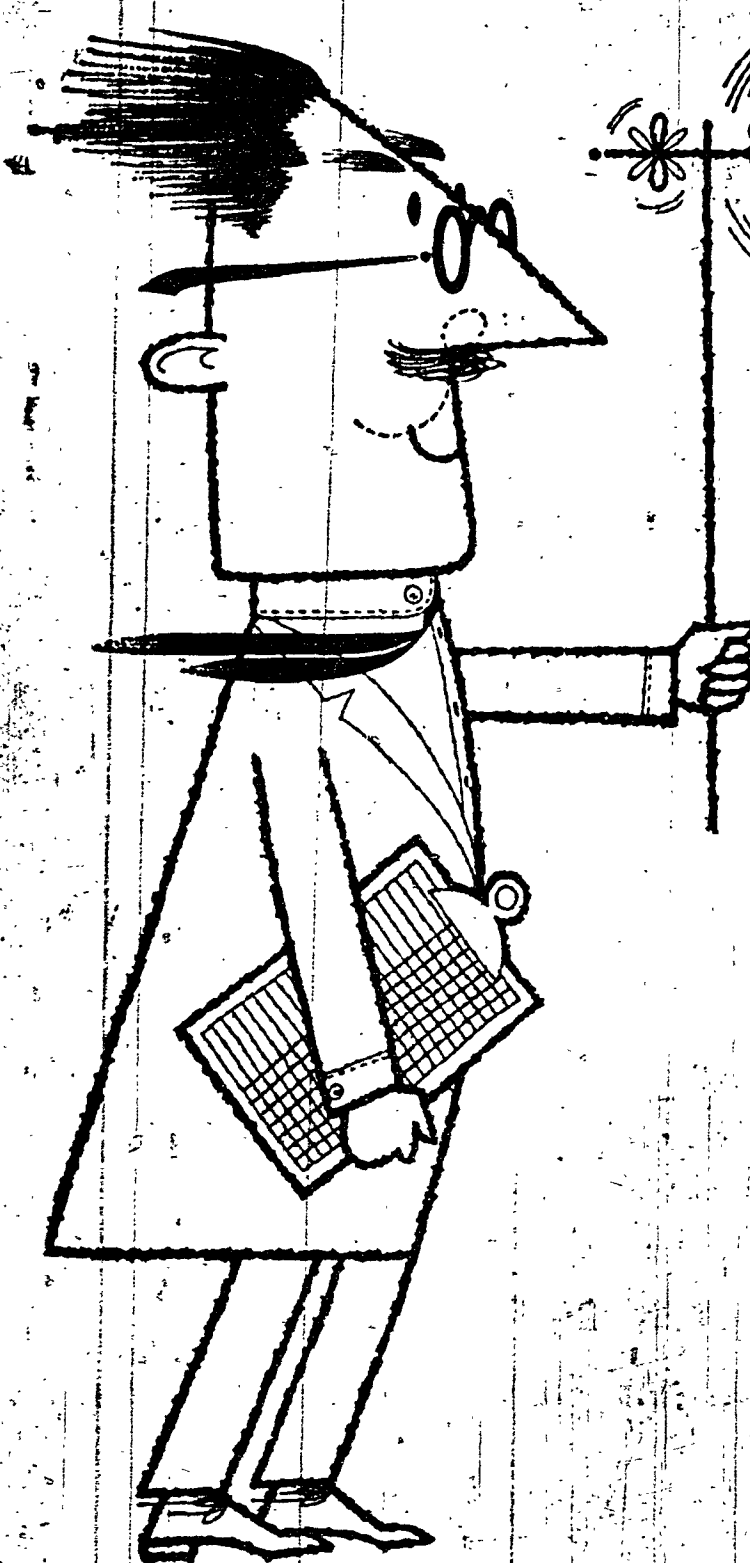
Boxes for the book drive will also be placed in each residence hall area.
