

# Malik Will Speak on Red Challenge

Dr. Charles H. Malik former president of the United Nations General Assembly, will speak on "You and the Communist Challenge," the first of a series of lectures on Communist ideology, at 8 p.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

**MALIK WAS PRESIDENT** of the 13th session of the U.N. General Assembly from Sept. 16, 1958 to March 13, 1959. From 1945 to 1959 he worked with the United Nations.

Previous to the presidency he was chairman of the Lebanon Delegation to the U.N. several years. As a Lebanon delegate he signed the United Nations Charter.

Malik was also chairman of the Human Rights Commission and president of the U.N. Security Council and the Economic and Social Council.

His political career includes service as the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Lebanon. From 1953 to 1955 he was Lebanon Ambassador to the United States.

**IN 1927 HE RECEIVED** a bachelor of arts degree with high honors in mathematics and physics

from the American University of Beirut. He also received a master of arts degree and a doctorate degree in philosophy from Harvard University.

Malik wrote several articles and pamphlets for the United Nations and American and European

newspapers and magazines.

He has lectured numerous times on human rights, the United Nations, liberal education, the challenge of Communism, east and west relations and the improvement of underdeveloped areas.

Frank S. Meyer, ex-Communist leader who is now associate editor of the "National Review," will speak on "Communism and Commitment" for the Communist challenge program at 7:30 p.m. Monday in Schwab.

Meyer, who is also an editorial adviser of the conservative quarterly, "Modern Age," worked for 14 years with the Communist Movement.

**MALIK AND MEYER** will participate in a forum on "Social Conditions in which Communism Thrives" at 4 p.m. Monday in the Hetzel Union assembly.

Monday's program will also include a movie, "A Citizen of Zion," to be shown at 3:30 p.m. in the HUB assembly.

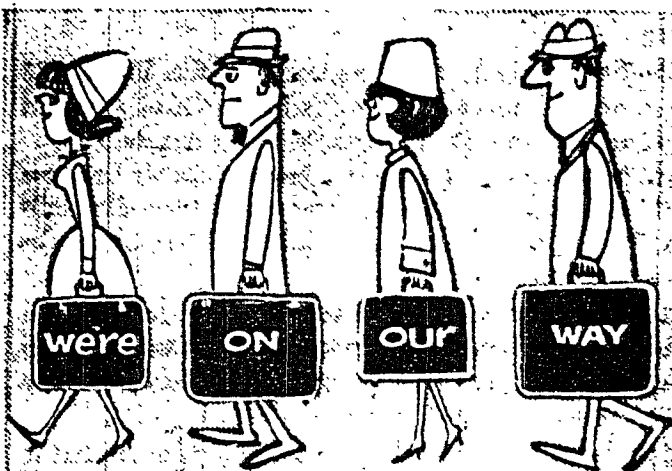
The program on Communist ideology is sponsored by the Newman Club and the University Christian Association.
