

Arcaro Near Retirement; Arizin Expects Close Tilt

NEW YORK (P) — Eddie Arcaro, the top money-winning jockey in the history of racing, is nearing retirement and a final decision on whether to quit the saddle immediately or ease from the saddle gradually is expected to be made today.

Now 46, the winner of more rich stakes races than any other jockey, hasn't ridden in this country since last November at Aqueduct.

In true Broadway fashion, Arcaro has sent out telegrams inviting friends and newsmen to a midtown restaurant late this afternoon. The reason for the get-together wasn't announced.

ARCARO, son of a former Cincinnati taxicab driver, won his first race on Eagle Bird at Agua Caliente, Mexico, Jan. 14, 1932.

He has won the Kentucky Derby five times, more than any other jockey. Six Preakness and six Belmont stakes winners have put him ahead of any rival in that department.

Ten years ago at Arlington Park, Chicago, Arcaro became the first American-born jockey to win 3,000 races, and remarked:

"I'm just going to keep on riding until I get tired and then I'll quit, whether it's 4,000 or 5,000 or what."

PHILADELPHIA (P) — Paul Arizin, veteran star forward of the Philadelphia Warriors and one of the National Basketball Association's all-time leading scorers, says if the Warriors can contain the Boston Celtics "good fast break it will be a great help toward beating them."

ARIZIN, WHO has been one of the Warriors' steady mainstays throughout the playoffs, was previewing tonight's sixth game of the best-of-seven Eastern Division playoffs here in Convention Hall. Boston leads the series, 3-2, and the Warriors must win to stay in contention.

All three Celtics victories came by decisive scores in Boston Garden, including Sunday's 119-104 triumph which was interrupted



