

Johnson Career Day Talk Ticket Distribution Begins Today

Ticket distribution for Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson's speech scheduled for 8 p.m. Tuesday in Schwab will begin today. Johnson's speech will conclude the day-long College of Business Administration Career Day. The topic of his address has not yet been announced, Robert Barraclough, chairman of the Career Day committee, said.

EACH BUSINESS Administration club member will receive one ticket at club meetings tonight, tomorrow and Thursday, Barraclough said. Other students

in the college may pick up tickets Friday at 110 Boucke. Other students and faculty members may obtain the remaining free tickets Monday at the Hetzel Union desk, he added.

The vice president began his political career as secretary to Rep. Richard Kleberg in 1932. Johnson was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1937 and served in that capacity until 1948 when he was elected to the Senate.

His political career was climaxed in 1960 with his election to the vice presidency.

The Career Day program will open at 2 p.m. with 7 panel discussions in Boucke.

The accounting panel will be led by Marshall Evans, vice president of the Westinghouse Electric Corporation, and Paul Katzen, president-elect of the Pennsylvania Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

H. MAURICE OVERLEY, general personnel supervisor of the Industrial Relations Department of the Atlantic Refining Company, will lead the panel discussion on economics.

The marketing panel will be

led by G. M. Hostage, district sales manager for Proctor and Gamble Company, and Brad Royer, district merchandising manager for American Stores, Inc.

Clyde Knapp, staff supervisor for the United States Steel Corporation, will lead the discussion on management.

THE FINANCE PANEL will be lead by Charles H. Fletcher, a vice president of the Mellon National Bank and Trust Company, and Clarke D. Young, assistant sales manager of the A. G. Becker Company.

Members of the Insurance and real estate panel will be John L. Bernard, home office representative of the Aetna Life Insurance Company; Roy C. Kern, educational director of the Life Insurance Company of North America, and John B. Kendig Jr., president of the Pennsylvania Realtors Association.

Arthur French, district operations manager of the Emery Air Freight Corporation, will head the discussion on transportation. A coffee hour at 4 p.m. in the Hetzel Union lounge will follow the discussions.
