(Continued from page one) reasons for the abolition of this punishment would be given.

THIS LETTER WOULD be distributed to influential persons on a statewide basis, along with a request that they indorse the abolition view.

A mimeographed copy of the letter, with the names of the endorseees signed below it, would be distributed to state legislators and other influential persons.

Such a campaign would be a logical and restrained method of achieving the desired support, a protester said.

In the group's discussion, it was

stated that there was already a similar group operating on a statewide level. The discussion then shifted to possible cooperation with this group.

THE SECOND ALTERNATIVE would be to begin a more limited campaign. This might be confined to Centre County or the University community.




