

# Hall, Saul, Mitinger Help Groom Grid Replacements

Three stars of last year's Gator Bowl champions are helping Rip Engle and his coaching staff groom their replacements for the 1962 version of the Penn State football team.

Quarterback Galen Hall, center Bill Saul and end Bob Mitinger—three mainstays of last season's Eastern championship team—have been assisting the Lion coaching staff during the spring drills on the practice field next to the golf course.

Hall, voted outstanding player in the Gator Bowl, is working with the quarterbacks. Finding a replacement for the balding senior is the number one problem the Nittanians face for next year.

Don Caum, Hall's understudy last year, and holdover Ron Coates are the two leading candidates for the position. Another quarterback, Pete Liske, passed up the spring drills to play baseball.

HALL HAS SIGNED a contract with the Washington Redskins of the National Football League.

Saul, the second draft choice of the Baltimore Colts of the NFL, is working with the centers and linebackers.

The Nittanians must find replacements for Saul and center Jay Huffman. Huffman shared the center duties for three years.

Mitinger, who has signed a professional contract with the San

Fullback Buddy Torris, who injured his knee in Monday's first day of practice, was suited out yesterday afternoon but didn't practice in the drills. Torris' injury was diagnosed as a slight sprain by team physician Alfred Griess.

The Lions will hold their first full-scale scrimmage Saturday. The spring drills will be culminated by the annual Blue-White game April 28.—John Morris.

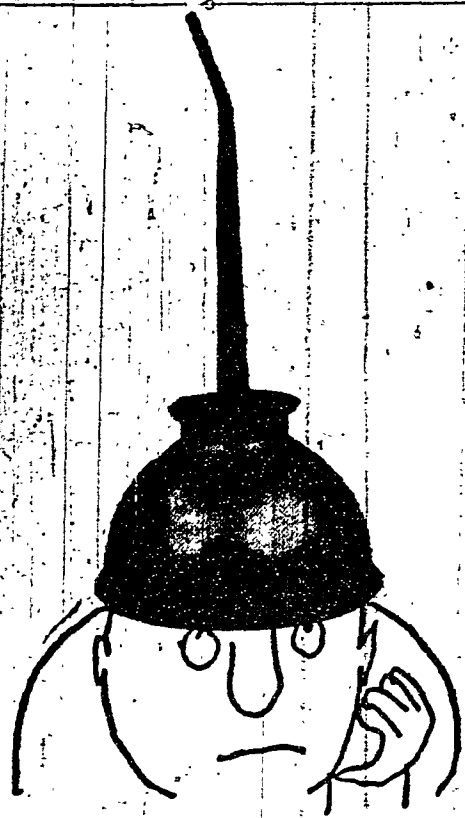
