

Red China Membership Vetoed by Model U.N.

Representation for Red China bloc nation. The delegates were Alice Brunton, Herbert Carver, Joan Dubin, Goldie Laris, Robert Schwab, Lefcourt, Eleanor Space and David Sprintzen.

The meetings, held in New York's Hotel Commodore, were attended by students from over 70 U.S. colleges and universities.

The model assembly was sponsored by the Collegiate Council for the United Nations. The host school was Queens College, N.Y.

A resolution submitted by members of the socialist and neutralist bloc would have included "the authority of mainland China" in disarmament committee discussions and voting. It was passed by that committee, 47-27, with 5 abstentions.

The same resolution later failed to receive the two-thirds vote needed to pass in the General Assembly. The vote was 40 for admittance, 37 opposed and 10 abstentions.

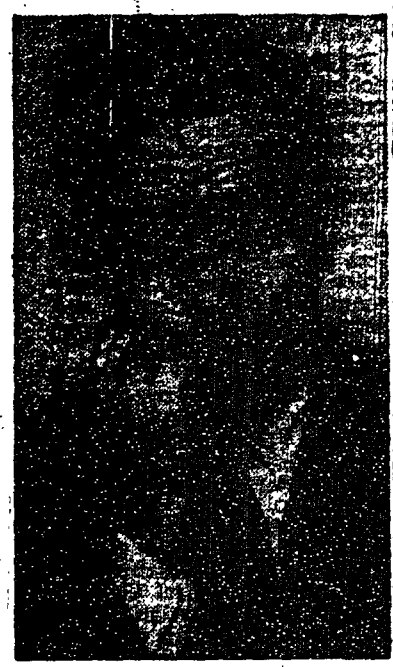

Easter Broadcast Scheduled

The 11 a.m. Easter Sunday Chapel Service will be telecast live from Schwab over WFBG-TV, Altoona. The service will mark the first live telecast from Lefcourt, Eleanor Space and David Sprintzen.

Lefcourt said the delegations from socialist nations found themselves envious. They were in a curious position as the "underdogs" who had to stop progress—Western progress, he added.

THE RUMANIAN delegation even staged a dramatic walk out on a committee discussion on the "troika" plan to reorganize the U.N. Secretariat, Lefcourt said. The delegation felt the chair was discriminating against it, he explained.

THE UNIVERSITY Chapel Choir, under the direction of Willa C. Taylor and James W. Beach, will sing with the accompaniment of the Brass Choir, directed by Rex Rockwell. Dr. Leonard Raver, chapel organist, will play at the service.

The music for the service was composed by George E. Ceiga, University organist, who used some of the traditional ritual patterns and words of the Anglican

A Community Sunrise Service will be held at 8 p.m. Easter Sunday on the steps of Old Main. The speaker will be Barrett Rudd, associate director of the University Christian Association.

STATE COLLEGE churches will also hold special Holy Week services. On Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, several community churches will add extra services to accommodate students. The Community Good Friday Service will be held from noon to 3 p.m. at the Presbyterian Church. St. Andrew's Episcopal Church will have a vigil at the same time.

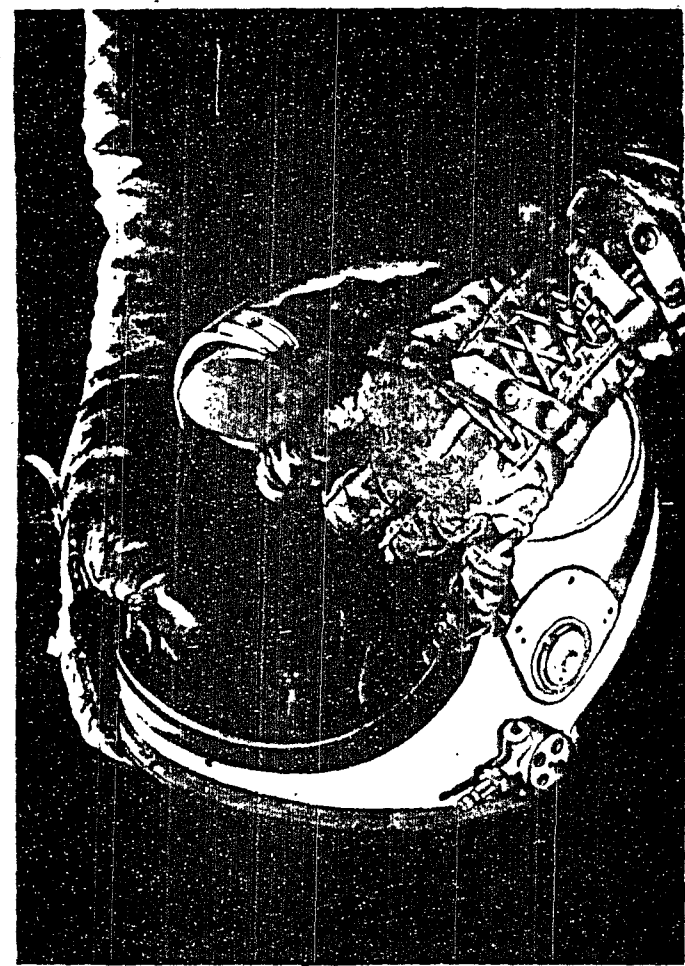
