(Continued from page one) The power to appoint the agency's chairman so that the student government could keep "a tie with the agency it created."

THE APPROVED measure is a combination of two bills, one presented by Foianini and the other by Edward Kotchi, chairman of the transportation committee under former SGA president Richard Haber.

One segment of Kotchi's bill was used as an amendment to Foianini's proposal. Foianini asked that the USG president be given

Kotchi proposed that the chairman be appointed from within the agency so that the position would be given to an experienced person.

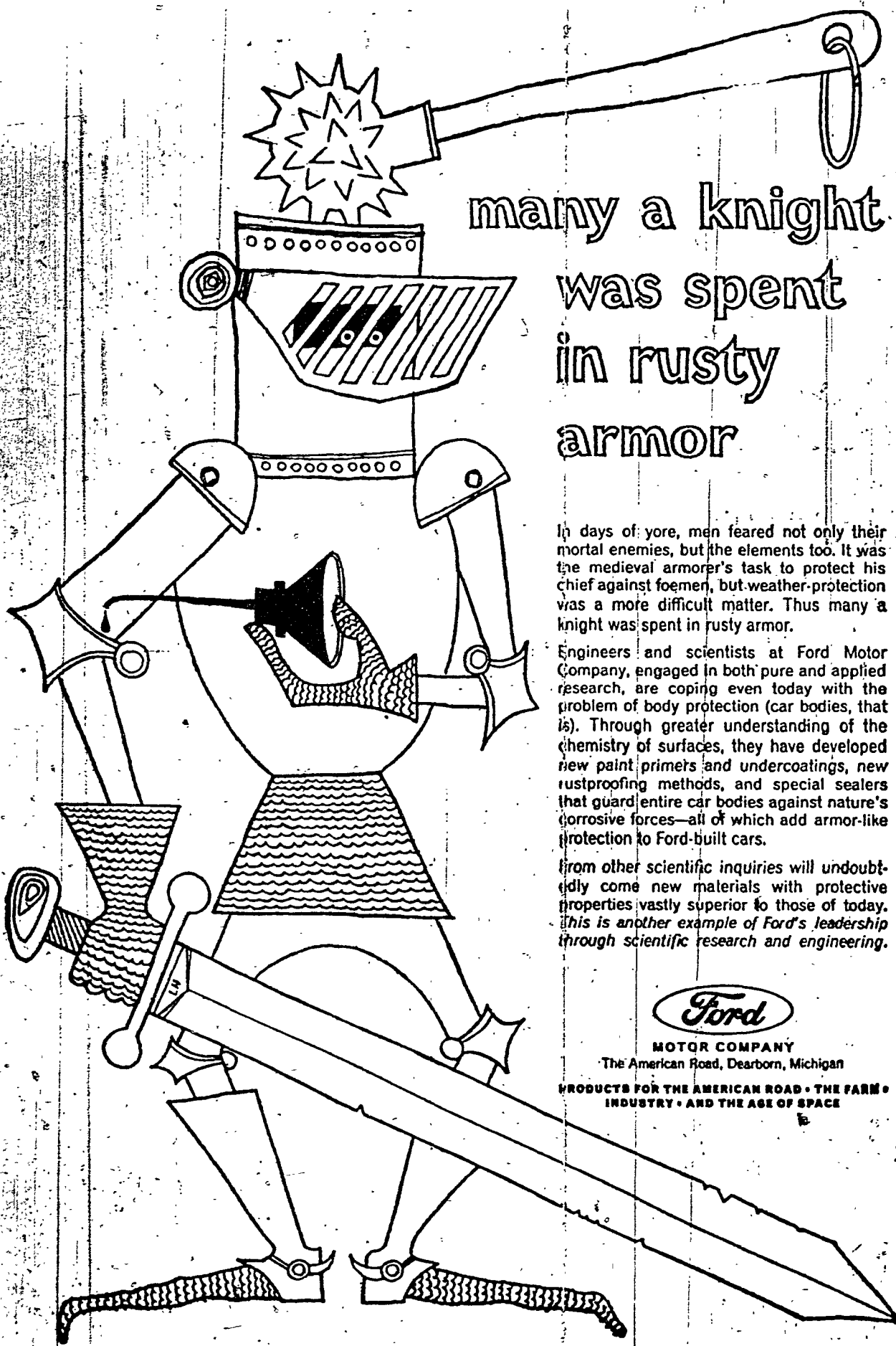
The compromise as it was adopted allowed for the agency to appoint its own chairman with the approval of the USG Congress.
