

Mahaffey Wins

Phillies, Nats Take Openers

CINCINNATI (P) — The Philadelphia Phils, who lost their first 17 games with Cincinnati last year, didn't roll over and play dead yesterday for the defending National League champion Reds.

The game, played under bright sunshine, attracted 28,605 fans but a strong wind chilled the customers and held attendance below the 32,000 capacity.

THE 15 HITS the Phils made off an array of Cincinnati pitchers were made up of 12 singles, a double and home runs by Clay Dalrymple and Don Demeter.

Joey Jay, a 21-game winner for Cincinnati last year, lasted only until the third inning and four other Redleg hurlers followed him to the mound.

WASHINGTON (P) — Bennie Daniels picked up where President Kennedy left off yesterday and pitched Washington to a 4-1 victory over Detroit before the largest crowd ever to see a baseball game in the nation's capital.

A weekend of rains, dark clouds and a thundershower that delayed the game for 22 minutes didn't dim the enthusiasm of the 44,383 fans who jammed the new District of Columbia Stadium to see the start of the American League season.

KENNEDY OPENED the show with a toss that slithered through the hands of a mob of ball players and fell to the ground, where it was pounced on eagerly by Senator relief pitcher Marty Kutyna.

The President braved the shower and a foul ball that nearly beamed him to watch the entire game.

Daniels struck out seven and walked only two in winning on his first opening day appearance. He also made two errors and singled to drive in a run.

Bob Johnson led the 13-hit Senator attack with three hits, two singles and a two-run homer that put the Senators ahead in the fourth.

The Tigers scored their run in the sixth inning when Jake Wood and Bill Bruton singled and Al Kaline hit into a force play.

Detroit threatened in the first inning when Wood singled and moved to second as Daniels threw wild trying to pick him off first. But the 29-year-old right-hander retired the next three men.

The attendance may climb higher. The Pirates said 12,000 general admission and bleacher seats will go on sale at 11 a.m. when the gates open. The game starts at 1:30 p.m.

The weather should be cooperative. The weatherman calls for a sunny and warmer day

with a high of 60 degrees. Veteran right-hander Bob Friend will be on the mound for the Pirates. Jim Owens will pitch for the Phillies.

Pirate Manager Danny Murtaugh will use the same batting lineup that won the World Series in 1960 and dropped to sixth place last year.

The Phillies lead the league with a 1-0 record following yesterday's 12-4 victory over defending National League champion Cincinnati.
