

Eng-Arch to Hold Open House

The College of Engineering and Architecture will hold an open house from 7 to 9:30 p.m. today in the college buildings.

The program was planned primarily for members of the Society of Sigma Xi, national research honorary society, and graduate students in technical fields, Paul Ebaugh, assistant dean of research in the college, said. It will be open to all interested persons, however.

The program consists of 21 exhibits and demonstrations located in Hammond, Sackett, Elec-

trical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Thermal Laboratory and Engineering Units B and E.

The exhibits represent all areas of engineering and architecture and are based on the various research projects being conducted here. Most of the exhibits are highly technical and are geared more to the level of the graduate student in engineering and architecture, Ebaugh said.

An information desk will be located in the exhibition area of Hammond. Tours will be conducted from this point between 7 and 9:30 p.m.
