

IFC Schedules Annual Workshop

The Interfraternity Council will hold its annual workshops, banquet and coffee hour Monday and Tuesday, Dean Wharton, IFC workshop chairman, said yesterday.

THE COFFEE HOUR for all fraternity and sorority presidents will be held at 3 p.m. Monday at the dean of men's office in Old Main. Executive secretaries, from Phi Epsilon Pi, Phi Sigma Delta, Phi Kappa Psi, Tau Epsilon Phi, Pi Kappa Phi and Delta Phi fraternities will also attend the function.

James McCloud, dean of students at Northwestern University, will be the principal speaker at the banquet which will be held

at 6 p.m. Monday in the Nittany Lion Inn, Wharton said.

The Sigma Chi fraternity improvement trophy for the fraternity with greatest improvement in scholarship standing, the social-professional trophy for the professional fraternity with the highest average and the social scholarship trophy for the social fraternity with the highest average will be awarded at the banquet, he added.

THE WORKSHOPS will begin at 6 p.m. Tuesday at the individual fraternity houses. Each fraternity is requested to send one representative to each of the 11 workshops, Wharton said.

ma Rho, chaplains at Acacia, house managers at Theta Chi, pledge masters at Phi Epsilon Pi, pledge presidents at Theta Delta Chi, and fraternity presidents at Kappa Sigma. Public relations and alumni relations chairmen will meet at Chi Phi, rushing chairmen at Sigma Alpha Mu, scholarship chairmen at Phi Gamma Delta, social chairmen at Beta Theta Pi and treasurers at Phi Kappa Psi.

EACH WORKSHOP will have a secretary who will record the minutes of the meeting. The minutes will be compiled by Wharton and given to Joseph Wells, booklet editor, who will have them published and distributed to each fraternity.

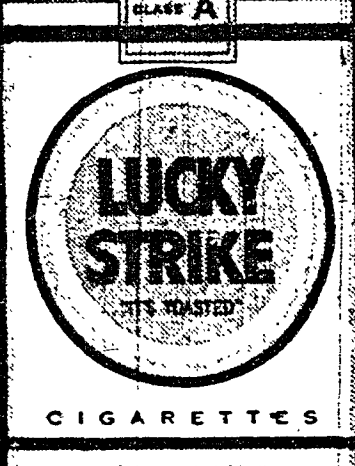
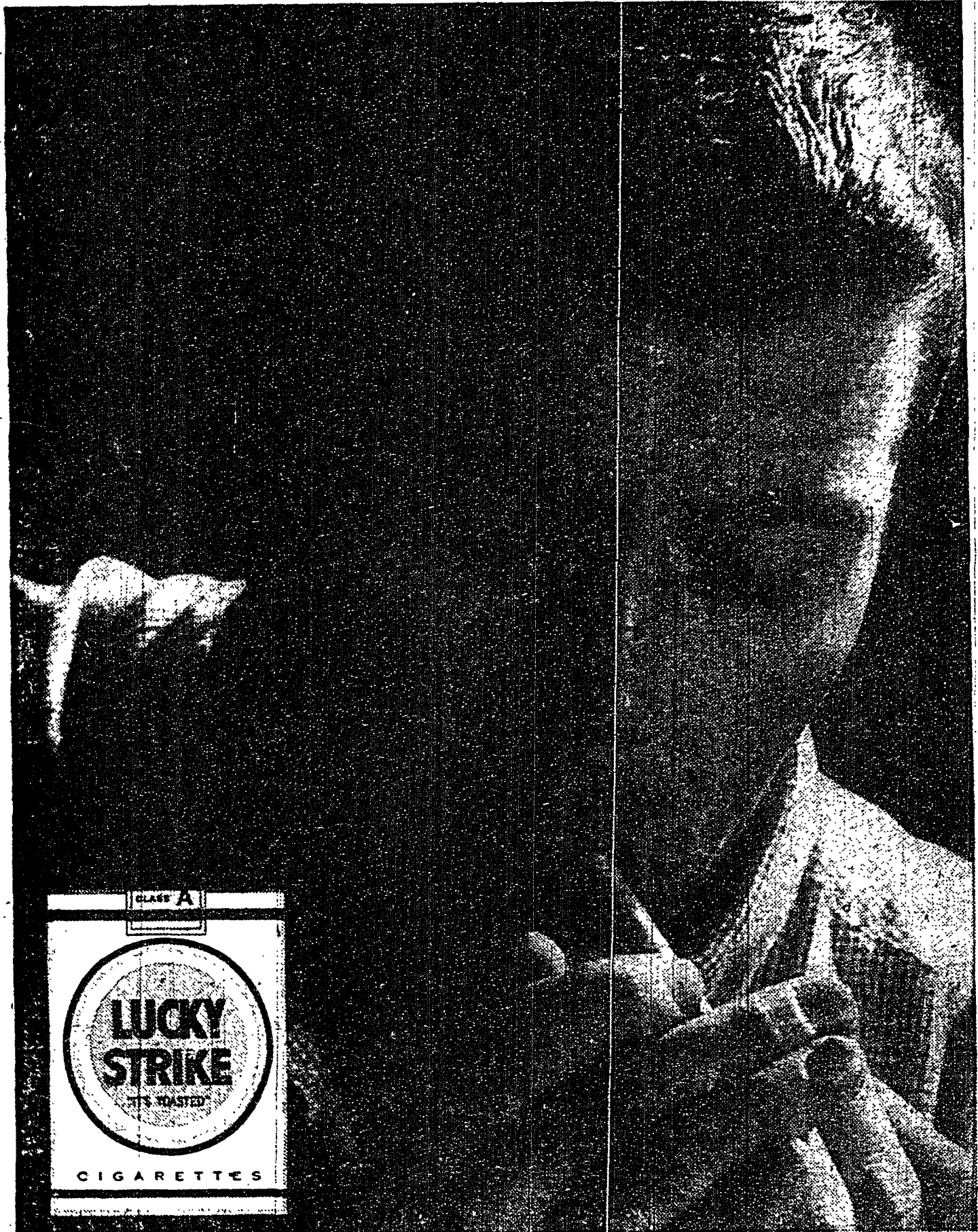
