

### Debate Team Defeats Mount Mercy

In a televised pre-recorded match on Channel 2, KDKA-TV, last night, the Men's Debate team defeated the debate team from Mount Mercy College, Pittsburgh.

The University's team took the affirmative side on the question, "Resolved: That the United States should join the common market."

The University team's 2 to 1 decision over Mount Mercy College entitles it to meet the Ohio

State team on May 10 in the semi-finals on the Counterpoint Debate Series, sponsored by KDKA-TV. The question for the May 10 match is "Resolved: That social security benefits should be extended to include medical care for the aged." The University team, comprised of William Stout, senior in engineering from Pittsburgh and David Goodhart, senior in education and speech from Rutherford, N.J., will gain take the affirmative side.

(Continued from page four) hounded while in power. Although Djilas is now disenchanted with Communist practices (not ideals), a statement he made in 1950 shows his former attraction to the system: "It is clear that we cannot make any political or economic concessions to the Western capitalist world because of


trade relations or because of this or that temporary need, because that would mean returning to capitalism, and we have passed a just sentence on capitalism." Nonetheless, Djilas has lived with the consequences of his more recent criticisms and has never yet retreated. He continues to probe delicate spots in the government, which, feel-

ing pain, responds by arresting him. Djilas' comments remain a phenomenon within the Communist sphere. When they become commonplace—that is, when Djilas and others can write what Djilas does, where he does, and still remain free—this will be evidence that the Communist system has undergone a thorough thaw in Yugoslavia.
