

Special Easter Dinner Planned

Students in residence halls will be served a special dinner complete with all the holiday trimmings on Easter Sunday.

An appetizer of frosted fruit shrub, a drink made with cranberry juice and pineapple sherbet will begin the menu, according to Robert C. Proffitt, director of food services.

BAKED CHICKEN breasts stuffed with cornbread dressing and topped with giblet gravy will be the main course. French cut

green beans with toasted almonds, whipped potatoes and Finnish cloverleaf rolls will also be served.

Jelly-bean sheet cake will complete the menu. The usual beverages of coffee, tea and milk will also be served.

Dishes of celery and carrot sticks, olives, pickles, cottage cheese, pickled beets and spiced crabapples will be featured on the relish tables.

Table centerpieces and all holiday decorations will be made by

the supervisors and student employees in the dining areas, Proffitt said.

A check with student employees and residence hall supervisors will be made to determine how many students plan to be in the dining halls for Easter dinner, he said.

GUEST MEAL TICKETS are available for this special dinner, as well as for all meals. They should be obtained in the dining area supervisors' office before Friday, Proffitt said.

Bike Inspection Continues Today

Bicycle inspection will take place today to continue the University's bicycle safety program. William C. Pelton, director of security, said recently.

Students may have their bicycles inspected between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. in Parking area 46 north of South Halls or, in case of rain, at the Skating Pavilion.

There is no charge for the inspection and registration. Bicycles registered at the University may also be operated in State College with no additional inspection, according to the security office.

Each bicycle must have a bell or horn, a reflector on the back fender, handlebar grips and secure saddle, and handlebars. Wheels must be properly aligned, the pedals must have rubber or metal cleats, and a headlamp must be attached if the vehicle is to be used after dark.

The tag issued at the registration-inspection must be affixed conspicuously to the bicycle. Bicycles found on University property without a tag will be considered as lost, abandoned or stolen and will be impounded until registered or redeemed by the owner. Bicycles must be equipped with the owner.
