Dr. Alfonso Rodriguez, associate director for Spanish-American Missions of the United Presbyterian Church, will speak on "God at Work in Latin America" at the 10:55 a.m. chapel service tomorrow in Schwab. Rodriguez's address will be the final event in the University's recognition of Pan American Week.
