

# Eight Students Receive Disciplinary Probation

Eight male students were given penalties of disciplinary probation Thursday for various offenses by the Senate Sub-Committee on Discipline, Daniel R. Leasure, assistant to the dean of men, said yesterday.

When a student is given disciplinary probation an official notification of the offense and penalty is written on his transcript, a notice of the action is sent to his parents and his participation in student activities is limited, Leasure said.

**FOUR FRESHMEN** were placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the 1962 fall term. They were apprehended drinking alcoholic beverages in a residence hall on the night of March 31.

A counselor discovered and reported the offense after investigating loud singing heard in one of the student's rooms.

The only upperclassman, a sophomore, who was disciplined this week by the sub-committee, was placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the fall term 1962 for nine previous offenses.

He had received a number of warnings for quiet hours violations, Leasure said, and the sub-committee took action on the case because of the student's repeated misbehavior.

Another freshman was placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the fall term 1962 for disorderly conduct. The case was referred to the University after the student was found under a blanket with a coed in the area of Sunset Park in State College by

the local police. A resident of the area had called police to the scene of the incident. Disciplinary action for the coed will be handled through the dean of women's office, Leasure said.

**A FRESHMAN** was placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the spring term 1962 for drinking alcoholic beverages on campus, Leasure said. The student was found by a counselor in the area of one of the residence halls with a near empty bottle Leasure said.

Another freshman received disciplinary probation until the end of the spring term 1962 for refusing to obey the dean of men's dress code for the Sunday noon meal and using obscene language in front of a counselor who questioned him, Leasure said.

## Forestry Prof to Attend Annual Quebec Seminar

Orval A. Schmidt, associate professor of forestry, will attend the third annual "Forest Operations Research Course" at Laval University in Quebec, Monday through May 5, representing the School of Forestry and The Department of Wood Utilization.

The course, rated highest on this continent, will deal with logging engineering and systems opportunities for reducing wood cost and improved managerial decisions in the logging industry. Schmidt, with 25 years of logging and milling experience, has recently served as a consultant in Panama and in Chile.

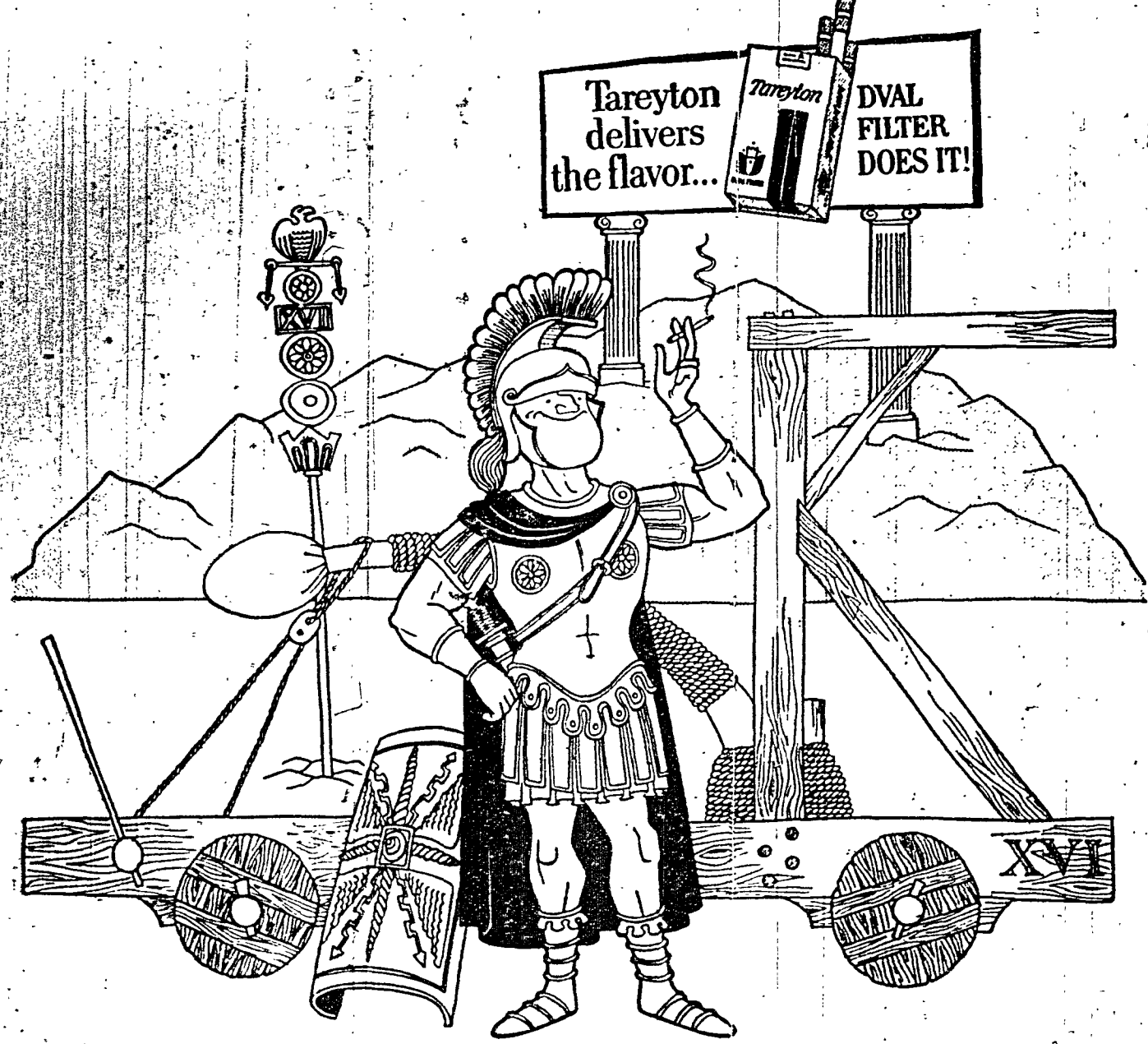

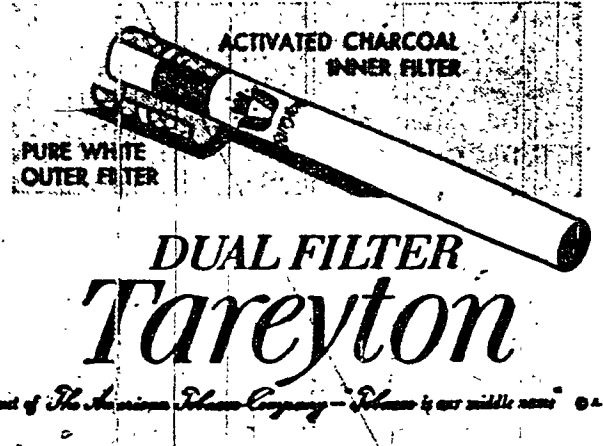
