### Mateer Playhouse Schedules 7 Plays for Summer Run

Four comedies, two dramas and a musical review are on the schedule of plays to be presented at Mateer Playhouse this summer. The ten-week program includes three plays which will run for two weeks each.

Dr. Walter H. Walters, head of the Department of Theatre Arts, said that a five-night operation will be in effect this year, with opening nights on Tuesday. In the past, plays have opened on Monday and run for a week.

The purpose of the changes is to enable the director and the cast to prepare each production with more polish, Walters said.

The playhouse, located ten miles south of State College on Route 545 at Standing Stone, is unique among summer theaters in that it is staffed by Equity actors and owned and operated by the Department of Theatre Arts.
