

# Sommons, Blasenstein Win IM Mat Crowns

Bob Sommons, Delta Upsilon 158-pounder, and independent heavyweight Joe Blasenstein were the only top-seeded wrestlers to come through with triumphs in the intramural finals last night in Rec Hall.

Sommons, who recorded the only fall in the fraternity finals, pinned Bob Gillmor of Sigma Nu 1:03. Blasenstein scored a lopsided 10-2 win over Harry Hillier of Hickory House for his crown.

**DELTA Upsilon**, which clinched the team title in Wednesday's semi-finals, walked off with three individual crowns.

Besides Sommons, DU's champs were Carl Nelson in the 128-pound class and Hugh Paxton in the 135-pound class. DU's other finalist, 167-pounder Hal (Junior) Powell, was forced to forfeit to Ray Connell of Sigma Chi in order to make the trip to the Penn Relays with State's track team.

Delta Upsilon finished far in front with 143 points. Beta Theta Pi took second place with 85 points, three ahead of Sigma Chi. The independent title went to Butternut with 55 points. Lawrence had 38 and Franklin 33.

Four top-seeded matmen went down the drain in the finals. The first of these was Jerry Hans of Phi Mu Delta, who won the 128-pound fraternity title last year. He lost to Paxton, 7-0, for the 135-pound crown.

**SECOND-SEEDED** Paxton was the 128-pound independent champ in 1961. He used a takedown, two predicaments and riding time for his points.

The only other shutout in the fraternity finals was registered by Dave Grubbs of Beta Theta Pi, last year's 176-pound champ. His 5-0 blanking of top-seeded Ed White of Phi Delta Theta for the heavyweight title gave Beta second place in the final fraternity team standings.

Pete Erber of Phi Mu Delta, last year's 142-pound fraternity champ, fell before Art Maurer of Delta Theta Sigma in the 150-pound final, 3-1. Maurer used a second period reversal and riding

time for his points. Erber, who Curt Bierly, 176-pound independent had been top-seeded at 150, scored an escape.

The other top-seeded grappler losing in the finals was Wes Phillips, a 176-pounder from Lackawanna House. He lost on a split decision to Ron Enie of Balsam. The two had wrestled to a 4-4 tie, with Enie scoring two takedowns and Phillips having a reversal, escape and time advantage.

**NELSON TOPPED** Roger Long of Alpha Chi Sigma, 5-2, for the 128-pound title. Nelson scored his points on a takedown, reversal and riding time, while Long scored on a reversal.

The fraternity 176-pound title went to Alpha Kappa Lambda's

## 'New' Aaron Leads Win Over Phils

**MILWAUKEE (AP)** — Rookie Tommy Aaron moved out of brother Henry's shadow yesterday carrying a big bat as the Milwaukee Braves found the power to go with their rediscovered pitching and won their third straight game from the Philadelphia Phils, 10-4.

The 22-year-old Tommy, starting in place of Howie Bedell as Manager Birdie Tebbetts rotated his rookies, cut loose with a single, a triple and his first major league home run, batting in four runs and scoring three himself.

Bob Hendley posted his second victory in three decisions and ran his career record over Philadelphia to 3-0, allowing only five hits and two runs before he tired and was replaced by Hank Fischer in the eighth. Fischer gave up two consolation runs in the ninth.

The loser was rookie Jack Hamilton, who now is 1-2.

## Suspended Footballers Return to Class at Pitt

**PITTSBURGH (AP)** — Five University of Pittsburgh football players who were suspended from school last January for disciplinary reasons have returned to classes, Pitt officials said yesterday.

A spokesman for the university said the five returned for the opening of the third trimester at the school and will become eligible for athletics immediately.

The five are quarterbacks Paul Martha and Glenn Lehner, tackle Bob Ostrosky, halfback Ray Conway and guard Jon Botula.




