

Construction of Bike Paths to Begin

Construction of bicycle paths to ease congestion and insure pedestrian safety on existing campus walks will begin in the near future, Stanley H. Campbell, vice president for business administration, said yesterday.

TWO REASONS WERE given by Campbell for the delay in the project, which was originally set to begin earlier this month.

He said the location of the paths has not yet been decided and the materials for the construction are not yet available.

"We are trying to develop a

network of paths," Campbell said, "which we will be able to utilize even after the campus has been fully built-up. We want the construction we're planning now to be the basis of a permanent system."

He added that representatives of the Department of Security and the Department of Physical Plant are meeting now to map out the location of the paths.

The plant which produces the asphalt used for the type of paths planned has not resumed operations for the spring, Campbell said.

Ag Students to Compete at 'Little International' Tomorrow

Agricultural students will compete for the title of "Grand Champion Showman" at the 45th annual Little International Livestock Show tomorrow at the skating rink.

Little International is a copy of the world famous Chicago International Livestock Show, Fred Thomas, show manager, said. Little International differs

in that it emphasizes the fitting and showmanship abilities of the contestant rather than the type and quality of his animal.

The show will open at 8 a.m. with competition in classes by breeds. Afternoon competition will select champion fitters and showmen in each breed, with final selection of an over-all champion in each breed category. The show

will climax with the selection of the grand champion showman.

Champions among cattle and horses from the University herds will also be exhibited at the show.

Among them will be the American quarter horse, Poco Shade, winner of the Michigan novice cutting championship and the register of merit in reining and pleasure horse classes.

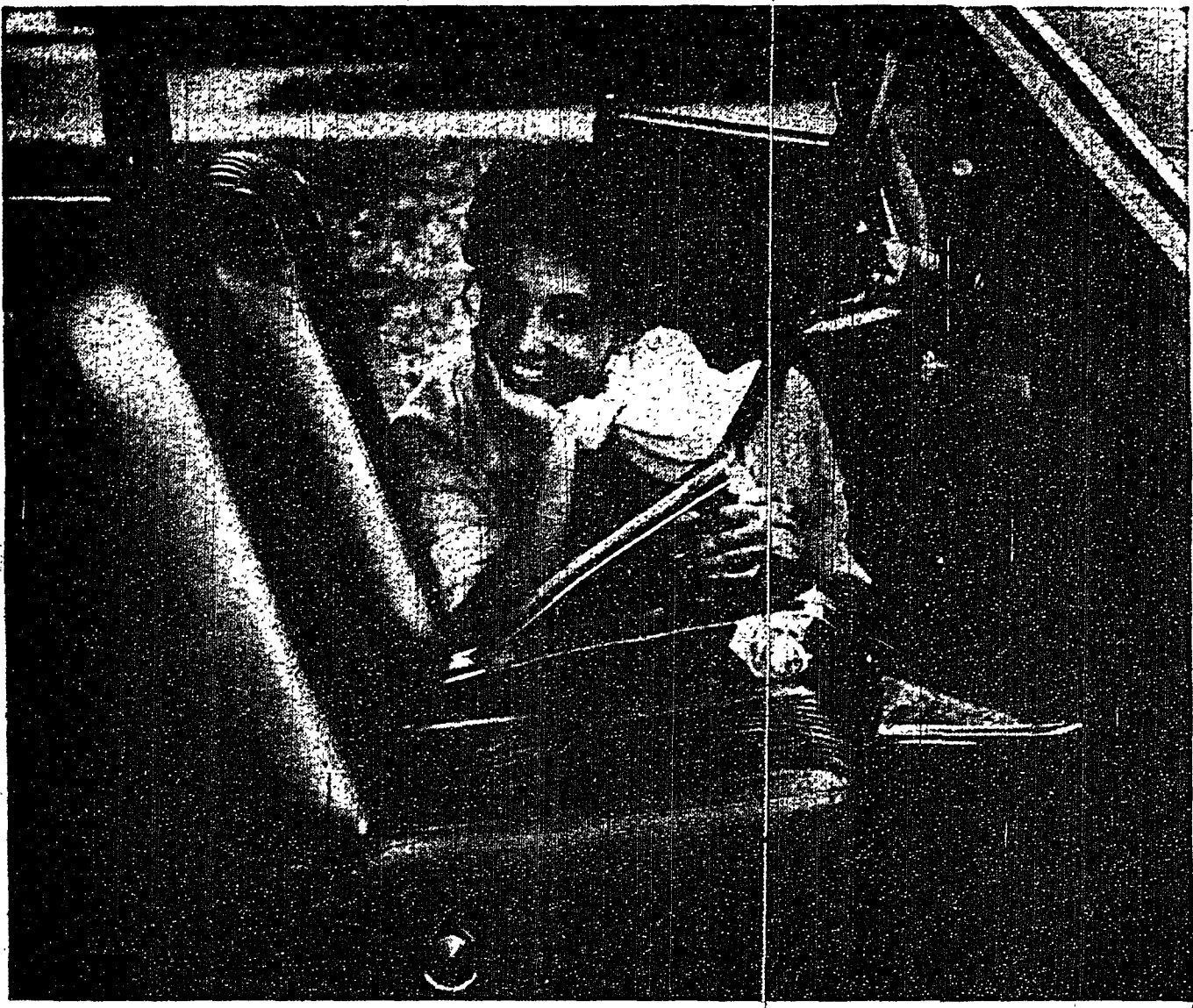
