

# Men's Residence Council Elects Mikulak Chairman

John Mikulak, president of the Nittany Halls Council, was elected chairman of the Men's Residence Hall Council by acclamation Monday night.

**KENNETH HERSHBERGER**, representative-at-large from West Halls Council, defeated Robert Fisher, president of East Halls Council, for the position of vice chairman.

Fisher, however, was unanimously elected to the position of executive secretary of the council.

Mikulak said after the meeting that "there is still a feeling of competition among the various residence hall areas and until this is dispelled, MRC cannot be effective."

At its last meeting, MRC adopted a new dress code which would have permitted men to wear bermuda shorts to all evening meals in the dining halls. However, the code was not approved by the dean of men's office.

Raymond O. Murphy, assistant to the dean of men, said at the meeting that the council's recommended dress code "was unacceptable."

If the code was adopted, it would set a double standard because coeds would want permission to wear bermuda shorts at

evening meals also, Murphy said. "Many students who live in the residence halls move into housing in downtown State College after a year and these students must get a respect for proper dress now," Murphy said.

Representatives of the various men's living areas met yesterday to further discuss the dress code with the dean of men's office.

**NEXT WEEK** the MRC committee will meet with some representatives from the Association of Women Students to consider common viewpoints and differences in dining hall regulations, Mikulak said.
