

West Virginia Golf Team Hands Nittanies First Setback, 5-4

MORGANTOWN, W. Va., May 1—West Virginia's golf team handed the Penn State linksmen their first loss of the season, 5-4, on the Lakeview Country Club course here.

The decisive margin came when the Mountaineers scored three points by sweeping wins in the last foursome. Until State's Dave Liebau and Paul Hummer were edged 1-up by their opponents and the West Virginia team took the "best ball" match of the group, coach Joe Boyle's linksmen were streaking toward their sixth victory with a 4-2 margin.

THE LEAD was not enough, however, as the Lion golfers lost a match they expected to win. West Virginia stretched its win and loss record to 7-2.

Captain Bob Swahn and Jim Tabor continued unbeaten for State, turning in the only victories. Tabor downed Jim Goodwin, 2-up, and Swahn overwhelmed Sid Bennett, 6 and 5, for the biggest

margin of the day. The Nittanies scored the rest of their points in the "best ball" foursomes. The Lion linksmen took the first two foursomes by scoring of 2-up and 3-2. Hummer, Liebau, and Gartner lost on the 18th holes for the Lions with 1-up scores, while teammate Bill Robinson was defeated by Jim Hess, 2 and 1.
