

# AWS Rules Clarification Given After Coed Poll

The dissatisfaction which women students have expressed with their judicial rules is the result of misunderstanding, Susan Starbird, chairman of the Association of Women Students' rules revision committee, said Wednesday night.

Of the 290 questionnaires returned, many indicated misconceptions about signing-out procedures, Miss Starbird said.

"The main purpose of signing out is to let the staff know that the individual has left the residence hall and that she has not returned if an emergency should arise," she said.

"If a woman takes the responsibility to state her destination specifically, she receives added protection proportionate to the amount of detail which she includes," Miss Starbird said.

A WOMAN who plans to remain in the lounge, recreation room or sorority suite with her date for the entire evening need not sign out, Miss Starbird said. However, the woman is still responsible for having her date out of the residence hall before closing hours and will receive late minutes accordingly, she said.

Many girls who answered the questionnaires were confused about travel procedure regula-

tions, Miss Starbird said. Under existing rules, a woman is not penalized for stating the latest possible sign-in time on the day of her expected return.

She is penalized only if she fails to return before the time she has indicated and fails to notify a member of the professional staff in her residence hall, Miss Starbird said.

DISSATISFACTION with guest regulations was expressed in many of the questionnaires, she said. The rule that each guest must have clean linen, provided by the University, is a state Board of Health regulation, she explained.

The rules revision committee is conducting an investigation to see whether or not the fee charged for bed and linen can be reduced, Miss Starbird said.

As a result of suggestions from the questionnaires, three rule changes were proposed by the committee and tentatively approved by the AWS Senate Wednesday night.

THE PROPOSED rules provide for 1 a.m. permissions at the beginning of terms, a penalty of 10 late-minutes for failure to sign in and informal attire for Saturday evening meals.

# Wharton Views Advisory Group

Dean Wharton, president of the Undergraduate Student Government, said last night that he supports the idea of an unaffiliated advisory board to investigate interests in Spring Week events.

Wharton added that he hopes USG and the Spring Week chairman will seriously consider any recommendations from the group.

Plans for the establishment of an unaffiliated Spring Week advisory board composed of representatives of the student governing bodies were announced Tuesday night by Emil Sos, Interfraternity Council president. The board would poll all participating

groups to determine their interests and opinions concerning Spring Week events.

"It seems only fair to me that groups who participate in Spring Week should have the decision on whether there is a float parade or carnival," Wharton said.

He added that he hopes all factors, such as money for scholarships, town relations and participation are considered before a decision is made.

Sos said last night that the advisory board will also investigate considerations for Homecoming activities.

# Post Offices Will Receive Survey Forms

Completed surveys on students' attitudes toward the University must be returned to the office of student Affairs Research through residence hall post offices as soon as possible, Mrs. Louise Mason, psychologist in the Student Affairs Office, said yesterday.

If any student has misplaced or destroyed his survey, he should phone UN 5-6357, extension 26, and request another copy, she said.

Over 900 survey forms have been returned, Mrs. Mason said. The missing surveys are in most cases those of students living on campus.

Many of these forms are missing because some residence hall post office workers did not return the surveys through the inter-campus mail, she explained.

WILBUR F. DIEHL, supervisor of mail and telephone services, and James S. Kline, head of the room assignment division of the Department of Housing, have given all post office personnel instructions about the surveys, she said, so there should be no further difficulty in returning the copies.

The surveys should be returned promptly, Mrs. Mason explained, because they must be compiled for President Eric A. Walker's office before the end of the term.
