

Lion Thinclads Host Spartans

Penn State track fans will get their first chance in almost a year to see the Lion thinclads in action on the home oval today when Michigan State invades Beaver Field. The field events will begin at 1:30, running events at 2:00.

State has not run a meet on its own track since May 20 of last year, when it beat the powerful Quantico Marines, 68 1/6-65 5/8.

The Spartans have good sprinters and distance men, but are not especially strong in the field events.

Lion distance star Steve Moorhead will meet an old foe, Gerald Young, in the mile run. Moorhead beat Young, the 1961 Big Ten indoor two-mile champion, in the mile run last year. A judge's decision was necessary to decide the winner since both runners finished in 4:14.1. State won the triangular meet with 65 1/2 points. Michigan State had 49 1/2, Ohio State 46.

The Lion captain was the victor in another personal duel two weeks ago. He finished the 3000-meter steeplechase in the Ohio Relays at Columbus in 9:44.1 to edge Young, the 1961 champion, who finished second.

Gerry Norman will also run against Young in the mile and the two-mile. The longer race should be close with both men in their specialty.

TONY WAYNE, with a 100-yard dash time of 9.9 seconds, and Steve Popp will be up against Michigan State's Zack Ford in the sprints. Ford nipped Penn State's star sprinter Bobby Brown in the 220-yard dash last year.

The Spartans have plenty of good material for future years, with two sophomores being especially outstanding. Sherman Lewis, the leading scorer in this year's Big Ten indoor meet, will give plenty of trouble to the Lions' 440 men and broad jumper Bob Grantham.

Lewis won the Big Ten indoor 300-yard dash in 31.2 seconds, the broad jump with a 24'6" leap, and placed second in the 60-yard dash in 6.3 seconds. He also won the ICA broad jump.

Another sophomore, John Parker, ran the 440 in 46.7 seconds last year to set a national collegiate freshman mark. State's Tom Mettrick and Mike Miller will run against Parker and Lewis in the 440.

STATE HIGH JUMP record-holder Jerry Wettstone will have tough competition in the Spartans' Wilmer Johnson. Johnson, Pennsylvania state champion for three years, jumped 6'7 1/2" to win the Eastern AAU title last year. However, his best this winter was 6'5". Wettstone's record, set during the indoor season, is 6'8 3/4", but his best so far this spring is 6'4".

George Barnhill, who will compete today for the first time this season, will meet Spartan hurdler Herman Johnson. Barnhill has been nursing a pulled thigh muscle since the beginning of spring practice.

John Courtney will throw the discus, Ron Beard and Ciró Risoldi will pole vault and Tom Urbanik will throw the shot for the Lions in the field events.

Frosh Trackmen Meet Cornell

Penn State's freshman track team will meet the Cornell frosh in the 440, Terza and Watkins in at Ithaca, N.Y., this afternoon in its second and last meet of the season.

State's frosh were smashed by Navy in their opener, 95-36.

The Lions' only bright spots in the meet were the mile run and the javelin throw. Colin Grant and Jim Johnson finished in 4:34.2 and 4:41, respectively to finish first and second in the mile.

George Terza finished first in the javelin with a 204' 10 1/2" throw, 30' farther than the second place man, teammate Bob Watkins.

Cornell has been more fortunate than State in its one dual meet. The Cornell frosh slipped by Colgate's freshmen, 71 1/2-68 1/2, by sweeping the 440 and taking first places in the 220 low hurdles, two-mile, broad jump, pole vault, discus and shot put.

The best chances for the Lion cubs appear to be Grant and Engle.

Johnston in the mile, Zen Kwozko in the 440, Terza and Watkins in the javelin, Larry Allen in the 880, Tom Pinkerton in the pole vault, Ted Bond in the shot put and Don Frazier in the 100-yard dash.

Mitinger, Saul to Appear in Two All-Star Games

Penn State's Bob Mitinger and Bill Saul will appear in two all-star games this summer.

In June they'll play in the second Football Coaches All-American game in Buffalo, and August 3 will play for the College All-Stars against the National Football League champion Green Bay Packers in Chicago's Soldiers' Field.

Mitinger, who signed with the San Diego Chargers of the American League, played end for the Nitany Lions. Saul, who'll join the Baltimore Colts next fall, was a center and linebacker for Rip Engle.
