

OSGA Will Meet, Elect New Officers

Next year's officers of the Organization of Student Government Associations will be elected when the group holds its spring meeting this weekend.

OSGA was formed to coordinate the activities of the student governments of all the Commonwealth Campuses. It meets once each term at the University Park campus.

JOHN R. RACKLEY, vice president for resident instruction, will open the sessions Friday night with an address on the duties of an academic affairs officer.

Robert Fisher, OSGA president, said workshops are scheduled to follow Rackley's speech. The topics for discussion are the purpose and function of student government plus plans for the 1962 summer conference.

Fisher said the second annual OSGA student leadership conference will be held August 20 - 22 on this campus. A conference agenda will be submitted to OSGA

for approval at the workshop.

At Saturday morning's session Louis Huber, president of the Ogotz Campus student government, will report on the results of the OSGA four-term survey of the Commonwealth Campuses.

The OSGA will hear other reports on the Keystone Society, a hat society for Commonwealth Campuses; student insurance at the Commonwealth Campuses and the standardization of fiscal forms for the various student governments.

Bowling, chess and table tennis trophies will be presented to the league and section champions of the Commonwealth Campuses by Robert G. Bernreuter, special assistant to the president for student affairs, on Saturday morning.

DEAN WHARTON, president of the Undergraduate Student Government Association, and Randolph Carter, former president of the Ogotz student government, will represent University Park.

of old Beaver Field. Construction is scheduled to begin January 1963, with a tentative completion date set for August 1964.

The second unit of the Education-Psychology building, also to be located on the old Beaver Field. Construction is scheduled to begin December of this year, with the completion date set for July 1964.

A new Life Sciences Building,

to be built west of Frear Laboratory. Construction is scheduled to begin in November of this year, with the completion date set for August 1964.

In addition to these projects, Wiegand noted that there are four other construction projects currently under design, including a forestry center, a physical sciences building, and additional construction on Willard and Pattee Library.

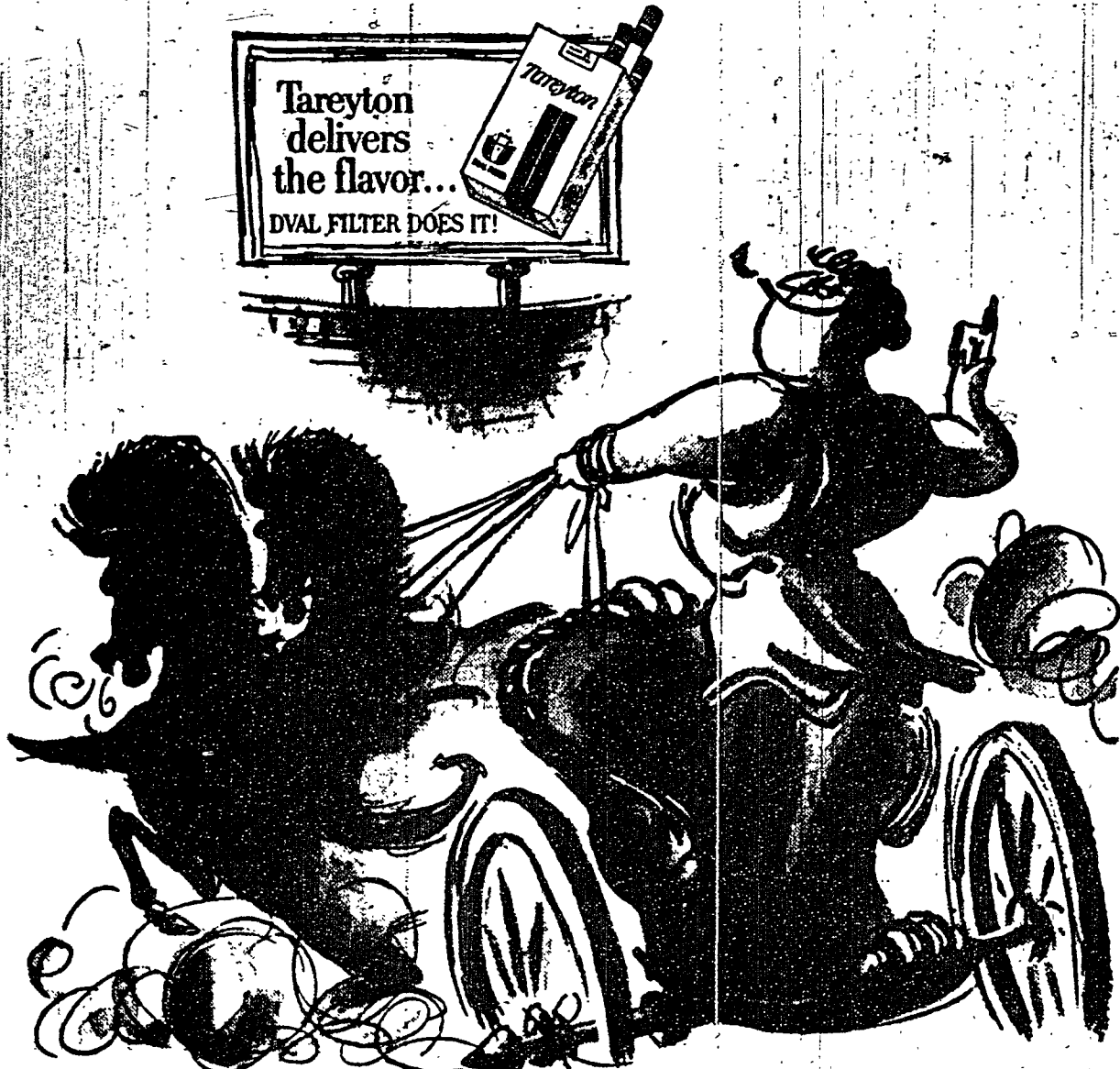
The contest brought together both black and white and color prints from students at various eastern schools. In the school standing, Lehigh was first and Penn State placed second.

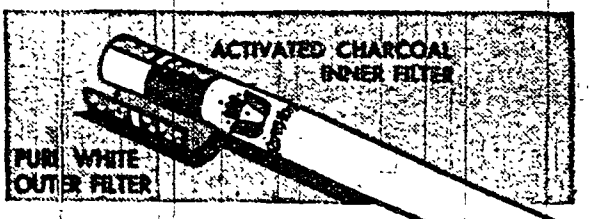
