

# Finch Maintains Contest Lead

Henry A. Finch, professor of philosophy, strengthened his lead yesterday as voting continues for the title of Prof Snarf. The contest is sponsored by the World University Service.

Finch, the Division of Counseling Student Council's nominee for Prof Snarf, had \$20.39. Robert F. Schmalz, assistant professor of geology, nominated by the Mineral Industries Student Council, moved into second place with \$16.86 replacing Helen I. Snyder, assistant professor of psychology, who held that position Wednesday, Robert Clapp, campus co-chairman of WUS, said.

Dr. Snyder, the Education Student Council's candidate dropped to third position with \$15.22.

**VOTING WILL** continue until 5 p.m. Friday, and the winner of the contest will be announced during the International Folk Festival program at 1:30 Saturday afternoon in the Hetzel Union ballroom, Clapp said.

The contest rules state that a person votes by money as often and as much as he wishes. In addition, all money given by a student council to WUS during the contest will be counted for that council's nominee, Olga Seastrom, campus co-chairman of WUS, said yesterday.

Gamma Sigma Sigma, women's service sorority, and Alpha Phi Omega, men's service fraternity, are helping to conduct the contest.

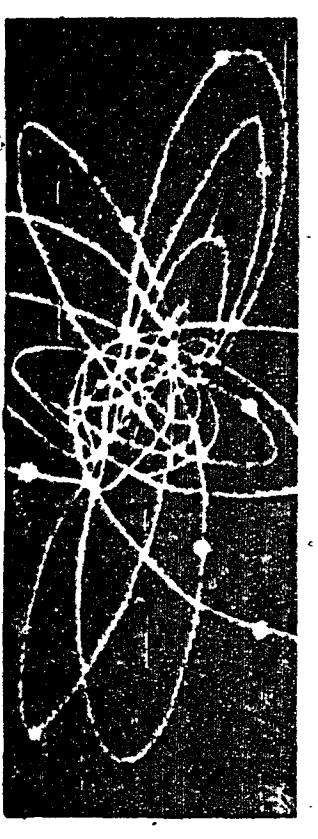

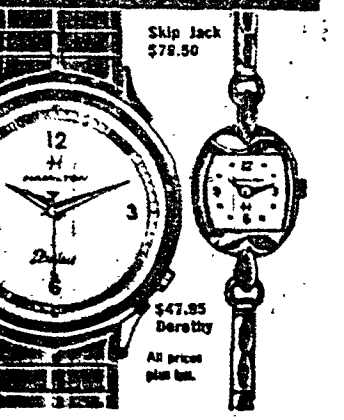
