

# Tabor Rates High in EIGA Tourney

Position: No. 1 man on the Penn State golf team. Record: Unbeaten in eight starts—the only perfect mark on a 7-1 Nittany squad.

If these credentials are a worthy enough qualification, sophomore Jim Tabor not only should fare well in the individual championships at the Eastern Intercollegiate Golf Association tourney at Cornell beginning tomorrow, but also should be a great aid to his Lion teammates who are optimistic on placing high in the event. Last year coach Joe Boyle's contingent finished ninth.

A qualifying round of 36 holes will be played tomorrow morning and the top 16 individuals of the 16 participant schools will vie for the individual crown beginning Sunday morning in a single elimination setup.

Although stroke play will determine the contestants for the individual laurels, Tabor shouldn't have too much trouble defeating his opponents in the opening round of match play. He'll play in a threesome with Navy's Don Eurbick and Penn's Vince Coviello, both of whom he defeated earlier this season.

"Tabor has a good chance of taking the title," Boyle said earlier this week, "but, as a matter of fact, so do a few of our other players if they get 'hot.' As a team, I think we'll do okay."

BOYLE SAID he feels Tabor has the attributes of a great golfer.

"He has the combination that it

takes to be a great in golf," said the linksman coach. "Tabor's got a tremendous attitude. Add this to his physical ability and you've got a pair of essentials that are hard to top."

Tabor gained much of his experience at West Shore Country Club near Harrisburg, Pa., where his father Ed, is a professional. Tabor recalled that he was 12-years old when he first took up golfing seriously.

He got off to a good start when he took the Junior Amateur crown in Harrisburg for two years, and since then has demonstrated remarkable progression.

LAST FALL in the ECAC sectional championships, which were held here, Tabor finished second and went on to Beth Page Park at Farmingdale, N.Y., where he took third place in the eastern event.

Enrolled in the landscape architecture curriculum, Tabor plans to be a golf course architect in
