

Nittany Netmen in Usual Role As Underdogs Against Colgate

The Penn State tennis team once again plays the underdog role when it faces the Red Raiders of Colgate this afternoon at Hamilton, N.Y.

State first played Colgate in tennis back in 1942. The results of that match have long been forgotten. However, during the transpiring years the Red Raiders have beaten the Lion netters with almost monotonous regularity. In fact, of the 24 matches that have taken place between the schools, State has been able to win but two.

The Lions are not the only team to be crushed by this awesome tennis machine. For in the 26 years that Perry Rockefeller has been head coach, the Red Raiders have compiled a remarkable record of 308 wins against only 84 setbacks.

FIVE MEMBERS of the Red Raider squad that dealt the Lions a 9-0 defeat last year will return to haunt State again this season. John Brandeis will probably face Lion captain Jim Baker in the number one singles position. Baker has not shaken off the effects of a groin injury suffered against Georgetown and may not be in top form today.

Whit Gray will face Raider captain Don Rankin in the number two spot.

In the number four spot, Csaba Balazs will play the Raider's Andy Zelman.

POSITIONS FIVE and six will find State's Steve Seitchik and John Coldren against John Druckleib and Dave Smith respectively. Seitchik has posted a record of one win and six losses thus far, his victory being recorded over Steve Levine of West Virginia by a 7-5, 3-6, 6-3 count. Coldren has fared a bit better, garnering a three win, three loss log.

The Lions have been sorely lacking a potent doubles combination so far. State has won only six of twenty-one doubles matches played. Balazs and Coldren have been the most consistent duo, but they've only been able to post a 2-2 chart.

Fogg expects to stick with the same doubles alignment with Baker and Gray playing number one, Isaacman and Seitchik playing second and Balazs and Coldren third.
