

Norman Faces Champ In Coliseum Relays

Penn State's Gerry Norman, one of the best distance runners in the East, will travel to the West—the Los Angeles Coliseum—where he will compete in the 22nd annual Coliseum Relays Friday night.

Norman has been invited to compete in the 5000-meter run against outstanding competition which includes: Barry McGee of New Zealand; Charlie Clark, formerly a standout for San Jose State; Jerry Smartt of the Southern Cal Striders; Pat Clohessy of Houston; Merle McGee of the Los Angeles Track Club; Danny Murphy, a freshman from San Jose State; Julia Marin of Southern Cal; Vic Zwolak of Villanova; Dennis Moore of Abilene Christian and Australia; Mal Robertson, unattached; Bob Soth of the Striders; and Jerry Ashmore of the Western Michigan and Los Angeles Track Club.

The biggest names in the race are Soth, who ran in the American-Russian meet, and Clohessy, the national collegiate champ.

THE COLISEUM Relays record for the 5000-meter run is 14:25.5 set by Al Lawrence of the University of Houston in 1960. However, according to Bill Hunter, the meet chairman, this mark is expected to fall Friday night.

Norman, who runs the two-mile in competition for State, has never run 5000 meters.

The distance, about 188 yards longer than three miles, will be run on a new Olympic-type track of crushed-brick-clay. The new track will be used for the first time.

The longest race Norman ran this year was three miles in the Ohio Relays last month. He won the event in 14:03.8, easily outdistancing his nearest competitor.

SOME CURRENT headliners who will run in other events in the Relays are New Zealand's world mile record-holder, Peter Snell, and Italy's Livio Berruti, 1960 Olympic champion in the 200-meter dash.

Norman ran a 9:00.5 two-mile in Saturday's dual meet against Pitt as part of his pre-race training. His time, which smashed the meet record by 18 seconds, placed him in a group of 12 Penn State

athletes who turned in the best performance of their careers in the meet.

Coach Chick Werner had high praise for the other members, Howie Deardorff and Ciro Risoldi, who set new records, and Steve Moorhead, Earl Pace, Jim Tyson, Hal Powell, Dave Kessler, Tom Mettrick, John Courtney, Tom Urbanik and Lionel Bassett.

"This is the best record of any Penn State team that I can remember," Werner commented.
