

DuBois Building Fund Kickoff Set for Tonight Prexy to Honor Scholars Tomorrow

President Eric A. Walker will be the featured speaker tonight when the DuBois Education Foundation kicks-off a drive to raise funds for the construction of two new buildings at the DuBois campus.

Walker will speak to members of the foundation and campaign workers at a dinner in DuBois. Wilmer E. Kenworthy, executive assistant to the President, said

Walker will discuss the functions of the campus in the University's current and future operations.

THE TWO PROPOSED buildings — a \$450,000 classroom-laboratory building and a \$150,000 physical education building — will give the University a capacity for about 450 students at DuBois, the number estimated as its likely 1970 enrollment, Kenneth L. Holderman, coordinator of com-

munity campuses, said yesterday.

The buildings in use today, Holderman said, are rented from the foundation for \$1 a year. The University is responsible for maintenance and repairs, he added.

In a brochure prepared by the foundation for the drive, Walker said the facilities as they are utilized now can accommodate fewer students than were enrolled at DuBois 20 years ago.

The President's Freshman Book Awards, the President Sparks Medal and the Evan Pugh Medals will be presented at the Honors Day ceremonies at 4 p.m. in 209 Home Economics South.

President Eric A. Walker will present the Freshman Book Awards to five students who completed their first two terms with 4.0 scholastic averages. The award consists of a Webster's International Dictionary with an inscribed bookplate.

Seventeen seniors and 18 juniors who stand scholastically in the top 0.5 per cent of their classes will be honored as Evan Pugh Scholars. The Honor Society Council, sponsoring Honors Day, will present gold medals to the seniors and silver medals to the juniors.

Walker will also award the President Sparks Medal. The medal is given to the student who earned a 4.0 scholastic average and showed the greatest improvement over his previous term.
