

Lion Nine Trips Bucknell, 8-4, Behind Fenton

LEWISBURG, Pa., May 17 — Now it's one down and two to go for the Penn State baseball team.

The Lions, faced with the necessity of winning all three of their games this week to remain in contention for the District 2 playoffs, came from behind this afternoon to beat Bucknell, 8-4.

Joe Bedenk's team takes on Pitt in a doubleheader on the Panthers' home grounds tomorrow. The district selection committee meets in Scranton Monday to pick four teams for the playoffs. The Lions (9-2) wind up their regular season schedule with a home game against Temple Tuesday.

Lefthander Bob Fenton was the man for the Nittanies today, limiting Bucknell to one run on two hits after the Bisons had bombed Lion starter Marlin Biesecker for three home runs in the first inning.

The Lions scored first on a walk to Fred Light, a single by Johnny Phillips and a run-scoring single by Dick Anderson in the first inning. But home runs by Sam Neisner, Ken Twiford and Ash Ditka gave the Bisons a 3-1 lead in the bottom of the inning.

The Lions narrowed the margin to 3-2 with another run in the second inning. Roger Kochman walked to open the frame, took third on a stray pickoff attempt and scored on Dick Pae's base hit.

Bison shortstop John Minsker homered for the Bisons' final run in the third inning. Fenton was practically untouchable after that, setting the Bisons down in order in the fourth, fifth, seventh, eighth and ninth innings.

THE NITTANIES broke the game open with four runs in the top of the fourth.

Don Jonas singled and scored on Kochman's double. Kochman took third on a wild pitch, but was tagged out at home on a squeeze bunt attempt by Fenton. Pae kept the rally going with a single and Don Robinson singled home Fenton. Light drove Pae and Robinson across with another single.

The Lions tagged on two more runs in the eighth inning on a tremendous home run to dead center by Kochman for his second and third RBI of the game.

The Lions out-hit the Bisons, 14-5, in a well-played game. The teams had an error apiece.

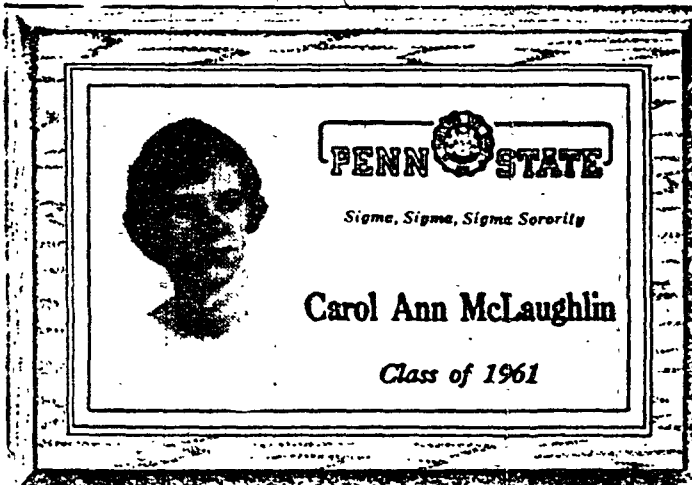

Delta Upsilon, Butternut Leading In Current Intramural Standings

While summer nears and the days grow hotter, so do Delta Upsilon entries in the intramural program.

For the past three years DU has reigned as all-University champs in the IM fraternity league, and if they keep going at their present pace, this year will be no different.

Since IM director Dutch Sykes released a points report at the beginning of the term, DU has risen in the standings from sixth to first place, dominating wrestling with three first place winners and one other finalist who lost by forfeit.

BY VIRTUE OF its mat victories, DU gained 218 points to surge ahead of second place Beta Theta Pi. Delta Upsilon (727) re-

tains only a slim 30 points margin over Beta (697), however, as IM's enter their final rounds of activity.
