Food Service Alters Menu For Summer

Even though the hot weather may be unbearable outside, summer dining hall menus promise to provide a refreshing atmosphere inside.

Several changes have been planned to meet the demands of the summer weather. These include more salads, cold cuts and basically lighter meals, Robert C. Proffitt, director of food services, said recently.

Corn on the cob, strawberries, peaches and other summer foods will be served when they are in season.

The welcome addition of ice tea at the beginning of this month is a summer tradition in the dining halls.

Most changes in menu arise from student requests. Food polls have never been used since some of these requests would naturally be impossible, but a student foods committee offers suggestions.

Composed of students on residence hall councils, this committee meets with representatives of Food Service periodically to submit menu suggestions.

"This is one of the best ways we have of communicating with the students and learning their opinions," Proffitt said.

With the close of the spring term drawing near, many dining hall units are now preparing to close their facilities until fall. Pollock Dining Hall will remain open to feed all summer term students because of its new recreational and dining facilities, he said.
