

HomeEc Offers Short-Term Courses

Five short-term courses will be taught by Margaret B. Jennings, associate professor of foods and nutrition during the summer term.

The courses are planned for graduate students, college and high school teachers, undergraduates who wish to accelerate and professional workers to study new developments in their field. The courses will be given in succession to allow students to enroll in more than one.

THE FIRST COURSE, advanced foods, scheduled for June 10, will

be taught by Margaret B. Jennings, associate professor of foods and nutrition.

A course in problems in foods and nutrition is scheduled for July 11-31. It will be taught by Miriam E. Lowenberg, head of the Department of Foods and Nutrition, for college teachers of foods and nutrition.

Leland J. Gordon, head of the Department of Economics at Denison University, Granville, Ohio, will teach a course of economic

conditions in relation to the family, Aug. 1-21.

A FOOD SERVICE and housing layout and design course, scheduled for Aug. 13-24, will be taught by S. Earl Thompson, head of the Department of Hotel and Institution Administration.

A one-week course, home economics seminar, is scheduled for Aug. 22-28. Marjorie East, head of the Department of Home Economics Education, will teach the course.

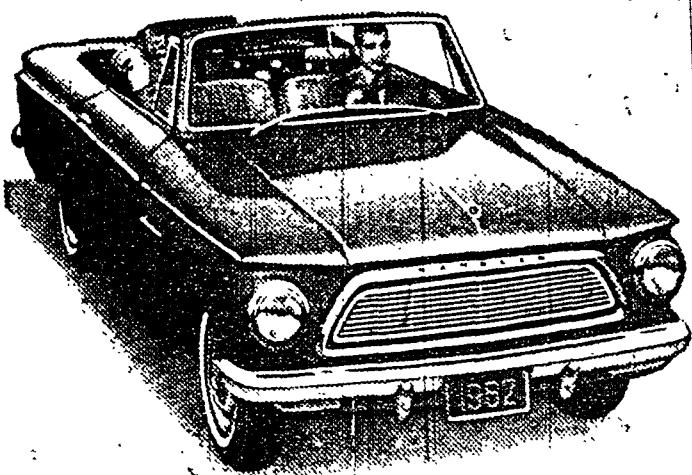
