

Harshbarger to Speak at Service

The Rev. Dr. Luther Harshbarger, University chaplain, will speak on "Image of a Christian" at the 10:55 a.m. Chapel Service tomorrow in Schwab.

THE CHAPEL CHOIR, under the direction of Willa C. Taylor, will present a musical arrangement for the Communion Service according to the Anglican tradition, by George E. Ceiga, University organist.

Through minor changes, Ceiga has been able to adapt the service to other seasons of the church year. The numbers will include "Antiphonal Prelude for Organ and Brass," "Invitatory Antiphon," "Kyrie," "Gloria Tibi," "Laus Tibi," "Credo," "Sursum Corda" and choral benediction for choir and instruments.

Leonard Raver, chapel organist, will play "Prelude and Fugue in

D Major" by Johann Sebastian Bach.

Harshbarger will deliver his final sermon as chaplain of the University. He has resigned from his post and that of co-ordinator of Religious affairs, effective Aug. 31, to accept a full-time appointment as professor of humanities and religious studies in the College of the Liberal Arts.

Robert Dengler, professor emeritus of Greek, will speak on "Asking of God" at the Protestant service of worship at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

THE MEDITATION Chapel Choir, under the direction of James W. Beach, will sing "Credo" from the Mass in G by Franz Schubert.

Elaine Shover, sophomore in music education from Bangor, will be the organist.

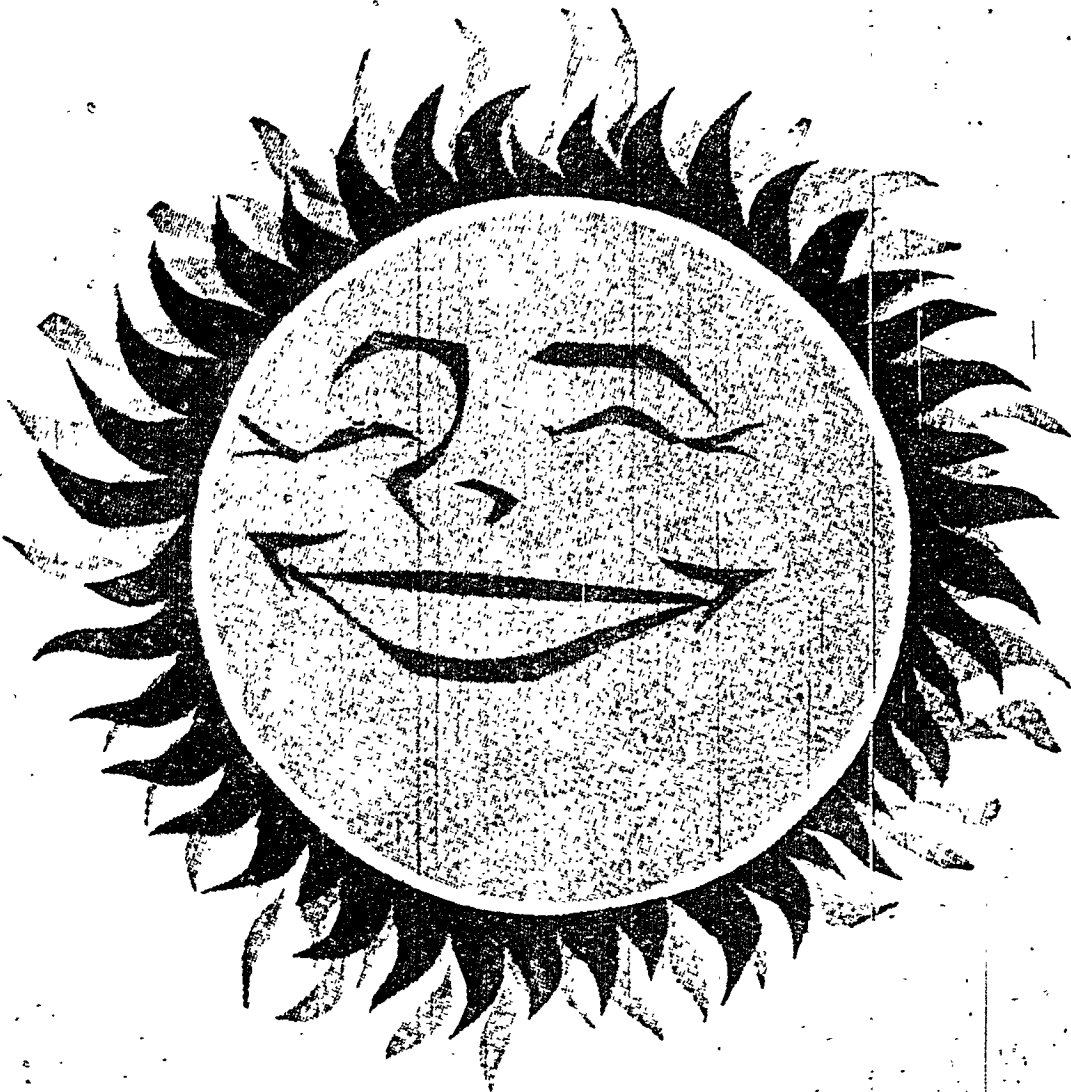
