

# Linksmen, Thinclads Golf Champs Meet in 'World Series' Stopped in NCAA's

Penn. State entrants in the NCAA track and golf championships failed to finish in the money.

The 36-hole qualifying scores of both Jim Tabor and Dave Liebau fell far short of the cutoff mark in the NCAA Golf Championships still in progress at Durham, N.C.

Tabor, victorious in 12 regular season matches, shot an 80 in Monday's opening round and an 84 in Tuesday's final 18 holes to fall eight strokes over the 156 limit needed to qualify for the match play finals which began yesterday.

Liebau, a semi-finalist in this year's Eastern championships at Cornell, carded a 162 score to miss the finals by six strokes.

Both Tabor (12-0) and Liebau (6-4) played major roles in this year's Lion golf squad which posted a record of eleven wins against a single setback. With two seasons of collegiate competition left, the Lion duo will combine with three other promising sophs to make the State golf picture a bright one for the years ahead.

and Steve Moorhead competed in the NCAA track and field championships held at Eugene, Oregon, but failed to place.

Norman finished seventh out of a field of 16 runners in the three-mile championship race won by defending champ Pat Clohessey of the University of Houston. Clohessey was clocked in 13:51.8.

NORMAN RAN the two-mile in State's dual meets and finished the season undefeated. His best time was 9:00.5, just over Dick Englebrink's school record of 8:59.9. The native of Bristol, England has competed in only two years of varsity competition, but has completed his four-year course in three years and will not be back next season.

Moorhead, captain of this year's track squad, finished far behind winner Pat Traynor of Villanova in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. The Lion senior was used mainly in the mile, where his best time was 4:10.5.

### Engle a Mule Driver

Lion football coach Rip Engle has a colorful background which includes work as a mule driver in the coal mines at age 14, a mine supervisor at 19, and a football player for the first time at 20.

### Beaver Moved in Parts

Old Beaver Field was dismantled after the 1959 season and moved in 700 pieces a mile and a half to the new east campus location. It was reassembled beneath the new super-structure.

AKRON, Ohio (P) — A "world series of golf," a super exclusive tournament matching the winners of the Masters, U.S. and British Opens and the PGA championships, will be played here Sept. 8-9 with a \$50,000 first prize at stake.

Only the four players—and may be less if there are double or triple champions—will be eligible for the 36-hole stroke play tournament at the Firestone Country Club, it was announced yesterday. One round will be played

on Saturday and the other on Sunday.

THE WORLD SERIES will be televised (NBC) both days with the TV show beginning each day at the 13th hole and carrying on to the finish.

Second place will be worth \$15,000 and third and fourth place a minimum of \$5,000 each. There's a possibility the third place award may be hiked to \$10,000.

Arnold Palmer, winner of the Masters, and Jack Nicklaus, who won the U.S. Open by beating Palmer in a playoff, already have qualified for the jackpot tourney. Nicklaus earned \$17,500 for the Open title.

The British Open, which will include both Palmer and Nicklaus in the field, will be played July 9-13 at the famous Troon course

in Scotland. The PGA will be held July 19-22 at the Aronimink Country Club in Newtown Square, Pa.

THE CHAMPIONS will gather at Akron two days in advance of the tourney for practice rounds Thursday and Friday, Sept. 6-7.

Play will be in twosomes—if four qualify—but the pairings will not be made until after the PGA.

The world series of golf is being produced by Walter Schwimmer Productions, Inc., of Chicago.

Schwimmer said the PGA will supervise the tourney.

### Czekaj Holds Record

Ed Czekaj, business manager of athletics at Penn State, holds the all-time Lion record for extra points in one season. In 1947 Czekaj converted 36 of 46 attempts.




