Forestry School Given \$4,000 Grant

The School of Forestry received a \$4,000 grant-in-aid from the Northeastern Forest Experiment Station of the United States Forest Service. The grant will be used for conducting research on soil moisture of forested watersheds.

The forestry department has been participating in a watershed management research program in

co-operation with the Agricultural Experiment Station and the Pennsylvania Department of Forest and Waters since 1957. The research is under the direction of William E. Sopper, assistant professor of forestry.

Six forested watersheds are located in the experimental forest in Stone Valley, one of the few university outdoor laboratories of this type in the nation.
