Fifty untitled sketches by Toulouse-Lautrec will be exhibited in the Hetzel Union gallery from Sunday to August 16.

Without any previous art instruction, Lautrec completed the fifty sketches before the age of 17.

This 19th century French artist is also well known for his ability to record facial expressions and gestures of people.

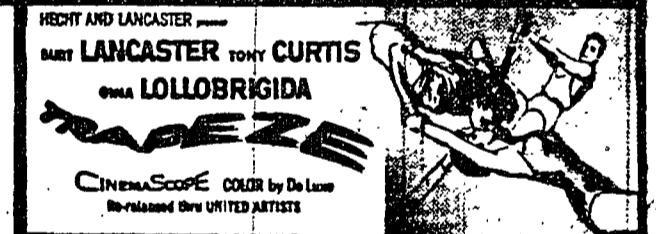
