

3 Students Disciplined By Senate Subcommittee

One student was suspended and two other students were disciplined by the Senate Subcommittee on Discipline last week. LeRoy S. Austin, associate dean of men, said Tuesday.

The 6th term business administration student, who was suspended until the end of the fall term 1962, had been reported to the University by the State College police for altering his birth date on his matriculation card, Austin said.

IN THIS CASE, even if the student did not attempt to use the altered matriculation card, action still would be taken by the subcommittee because it states on the back of the matriculation card "disciplinary action will result from the misuse of this card," Austin said.

In another case, an 11th term business administration student was placed on suspended suspen-

sion until his graduation for carrying out a plan to set off a false fire alarm in a men's residence hall, Austin said.

The incident, which occurred on June 4 was reported by a residence hall counselor who observed the student set off the alarm.

THE SUBCOMMITTEE also decided that a 10th term student in liberal arts, who submitted fraudulent information to the admissions office to gain readmission, would not be considered for reinstatement until the fall term 1964.

The fraudulent information given by the student was discovered during the week of June 17 while his application was being considered by the office, Austin said.

The student had dropped out of a school earlier this year, Austin said. The subcommittee had previously disciplined the student twice when he was enrolled here.

Oliver to Talk on 'Liberal Quest'

Oliver, who came to the University in 1949, spent six months in Korea as a special adviser to Syngman Rhee in 1951. He also

was a member of the Korean Commission to the United Nations. In addition to founding "Today's Speech," the official magazine of the Speech Association of the Eastern States, Oliver is the author of "Syngman Rhee: The Man Behind the Myth."

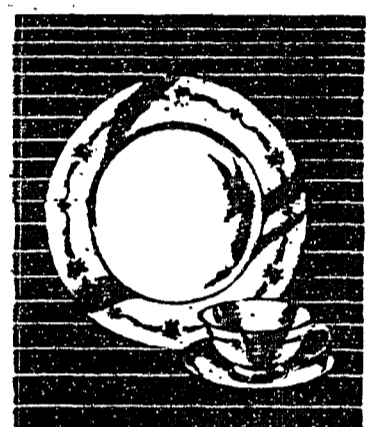
