Downtown Between the Movies

Crop Damage, Fires Hit State; Severe Drought Should Continue

A steady 12-hour rainfall is what Pennsylvania needs to overcome the dangerous drought now plaguing the state, but there are no indications of any ground-soaking rain for several days.

Reports of water shortages, forest fires and crop damage have been received from many sections of the Commonwealth.

Yesterday Governor David L. Lawrence requested the U.S. government to declare 22 drought-stricken counties, including Centre County, as federal disaster areas.

The drought has already had a disastrous effect on crops and livestock.

Tinder dry woodlands are extremely susceptible to fire, and a fire in a community 30 miles from

State College left 80 persons homeless Tuesday.

A few showers or thunderstorms are likely in the Commonwealth today and tonight, but these showers will be well scattered and of short duration.

Only four inches of rain has fallen in State College during the past 12 weeks. This is a mere one-third of the normal amount for that period, and much of it ran off the land as soon as it fell because it was of a showery nature.

The drought has been particularly severe in recent days, and the total rainfall for this month has been a scant three-hundredths of an inch.

Many sections of the state have received even less rainfall than

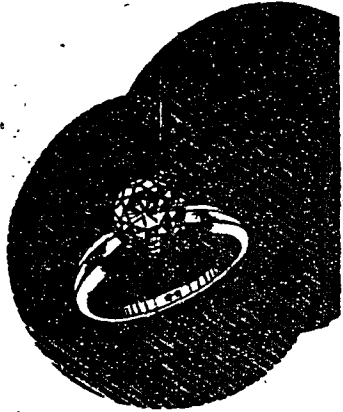

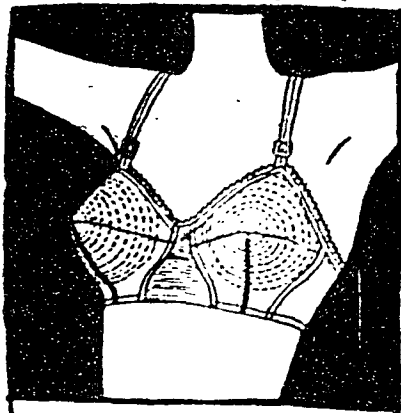
