

3-Day Exam Period Set

A survey of all University departments reveals that finals will be given fall term during the three-day final examination period in 75 per cent of all courses. John B. Miller, scheduling officer, said yesterday.

In the remaining 25 per cent of the courses, professors will either schedule final exams in the regular class periods during the last week of the term or will not give any final exams, Miller said.

THE DECISION concerning the scheduling of finals will be made by the instructor of the course, he said.

About 15 per cent of the student body will have conflicts with their exams scheduled at the same time, he said, and another 15 per cent will have three exams the same day.

The schedule for the finals period will be published in October, and students should file conflict requests at the scheduling office within a week. However, if such a request is presented late, a fee of \$10 will be charged to the student, he said.

Miller said that he cannot assure students that have three examinations on one day that this situation will be changed.

If the time for a final is changed for a student having a conflict, copies of the change will be given to the department concerned and to the student, he said.

Professors may have to give special attention to scheduling finals for graduating seniors, so that these students' grades may be turned in early since graduation is set for Dec. 8.

Starting the day after the end of the term, the final examination period will be held Dec. 4-6. The 75-minute finals will be scheduled from 8 a.m. to 9:55 p.m.

NO STUDENT, however, will have exams both periods three and four or periods six and seven so that he will not have to miss any meals, Miller said.

The fee for room and board will not be raised because of the three day extension, he added. It will cost the University approximately \$13 extra a year per student, he explained.

Ashby Receives DOC Post

Jefferson D. Ashby, assistant professor of psychology and assistant director of the Division of Counseling, has been appointed associate director of the division. Ashby is a graduate of Southern Illinois University, where he received his bachelor and master's degrees. His doctor of philosophy degree was conferred by Penn State.

Ashby will be in charge of all students registered in the Division of Counseling, of which there are about 1,500 per year. He also will be responsible for coordinating counseling work on the Commonwealth campuses. The new associate director will serve on the University's Committee on Academic Standards.

The class of 1962 established a loan fund with an initial gift of \$4,350.

Loans not exceeding \$500 in any one year will be available to full-time students working for bachelor or associate degrees.

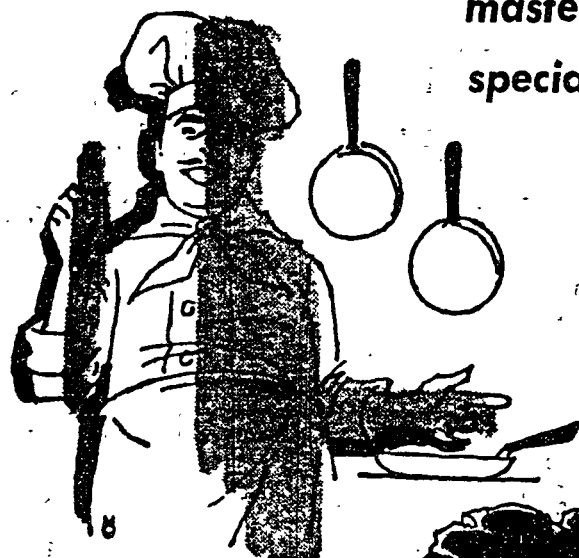
