Study Abroad Program

Term in Europe Offered

A year-old program which enables students to expand their knowledge of the culture of a foreign country by living and studying abroad will be continued this spring under the supervision of the College of the Liberal Arts.

The program, first tried this year at universities in Cologne,

Germany, and Strasbourg, France, includes study of languages, social sciences, literature and art. An attempt is made to house students with families in the university area.

Fifty students have been tentatively accepted to go to France and 25 to Germany. The program

is open to students who will be sophomores, juniors or seniors during the 1962-63 academic year.

THE COST of the term abroad will be approximately the same as the cost of a term at the University with the addition of travel expenses and a registration fee of \$35.

Efforts are now being made to arrange three additional foreign study groups in 1963, Dagobert de Levie, director of the Study Abroad Program, said.

Negotiations have been underway since May with two leading Spanish universities to establish a program in Spain. Forty students have been tentatively accepted for this term abroad.

"We are also attempting to organize a program in England for the spring term 1963," de Levie said. Under this plan, architecture students would take courses in architectural design and art plus the liberal arts, he added.

THE STUDY ABROAD committee also hopes to plan a term of study in England preceding the University Chapel Choir's tour of Europe next summer, de Levie said. No final agreement has been reached on either English plan or a program in Spain, he added.

Ben Euwema, dean of the College of the Liberal Arts, is scheduled to visit France, Germany and Spain this fall to conclude agreements, de Levie said. Announcements of the students participating will then be made, pending the outcome of final applications and interviews of those students tentatively accepted.

DE LEVIE also said that the University hopes to establish a Liberal Arts Study Abroad Program in England for the spring term 1964. This term would be open to all students of the University without foreign language facility who possess an interest in the liberal arts, he added.

Students considered for the program must have a 2.5 All-University average and must show evidence of maturity, self-discipline and strong academic motivation. Information about the program is available in the Study Abroad office, 4 Sparks.

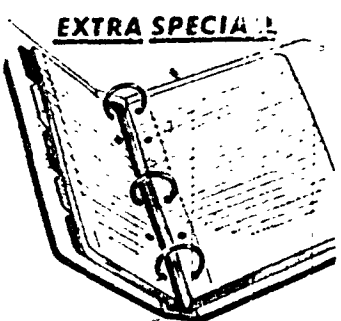

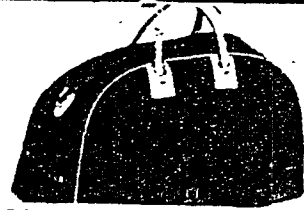
