

Supervision, Leadership Provided by Counselors

With 5,000 men living in residence halls on campus, the dean of men's office has employed upperclassmen as counselors to provide leadership and supervision in the living areas.

SOME OF THE responsibilities which the counselors are expected to assume are:

- To refer students to appropriate University agencies when they may need specialized help because of individual maladjustment.

- To advise and counsel students within the limits of training and capability on academic, personal, social and financial matters.

- To help organize educational, athletic, social and cultural activities.

- To supervise student conduct in the house and within the living area as a whole and interpret and explain University regulations to the students.

- To inform parents of those matters related to the student's welfare.

- To inform the dean of men's office of any misconduct of students which requires disciplinary action.

Residence hall counselors are selected by application and interview. They must be 21 years of age, have had two years of col-

lege plus a 2.3 All-University average and a previous term average of 2.00. Married students are generally not considered for these positions.

FOR REMUNERATION, counselors receive their room and board and waiver of out-of-state fees if applicable for the first year of service. If the counselor serves for a second year, he receives his room and board, one half of his University tuition and waiver of out-of-state fees if applicable.

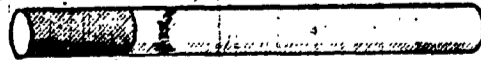

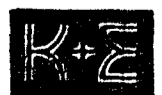
