Charles appeared on campus in the spring of 1961. At that time his singing style sparked a giant controversy as to whether he was a jazz or "rock 'n roll" singer.



The 30-year-old musician has been earning his living as a musician for over half his life, working professionally since he was orphaned at 15. He has been totally blind since the age of six.


