

Religion Prof to Talk Tomorrow in Schwab

Weekend Religious Events Set

Charles D. Spotts, professor of religion at Franklin and Marshall College, will be the speaker at the Chapel Service at 10:45 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

His topic will be "God's Purpose Fulfilled."

SPOTTS WILL BE available to discuss his sermon with interested persons following the service in the Green Room, which is located in the northwest corner of the balcony of Schwab.

The organ prelude, offertory and postlude will be played by George E. Ceiga, University organist.

His selections will be "Prelude in E Flat," "Chorale Prelude on

Schmucke dich" and "Postlude in E Flat" (St. Anne), all by Johann Sebastian Bach.

The choral responses, which will be sung by the Chapel Choir, directed by Mrs. Willa Taylor, were written by Ceiga.

The Rev. Barrett Rudd, acting director of the University Christian Association, and Dean Wharton, president of the Undergraduate Student Government, will assist with the service.

THE HYMNS for the service will be "God, my King, Thy Might Confessing" by Stuttgart, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" from St. Anne and "All my Hope on God is Founded," by Unser Herrscher.

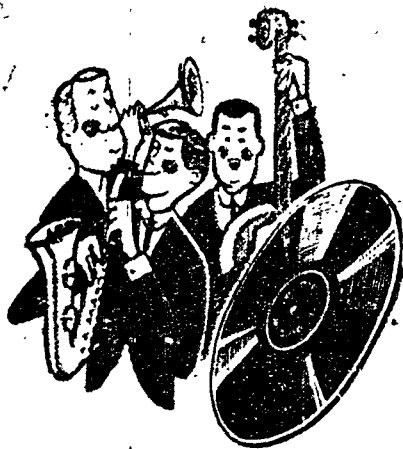
