

IFC Approves Scholastic Penalties

A supplement to the scholastic program to set up specific penalties for fraternities which fail to meet certain academic standards was approved by the Interfraternity Council last night.

According to the supplement, if a fraternity fails to maintain a cumulative average of 2.35 or if 25 per cent of its members does not attain a 2.000 All-University average action will be taken.

●If a fraternity fails to meet these requirements one or two terms, it will receive a letter of warning from the IFC scholastic committee.

●If the requirements are not met for three consecutive terms, the fraternity will be excluded from participation in Greek Week and Spring Week.

●If averages are not raised the fourth consecutive term, the fra-

ternity will not be permitted to take part in intramural sports. All new regulations will go into effect beginning this term.

It was also agreed that the Sigma Chi improvement trophy,

awarded to the fraternity whose cumulative average has shown the greatest increase, should be awarded once a year at the IFC workshop. This trophy was previously awarded each term.

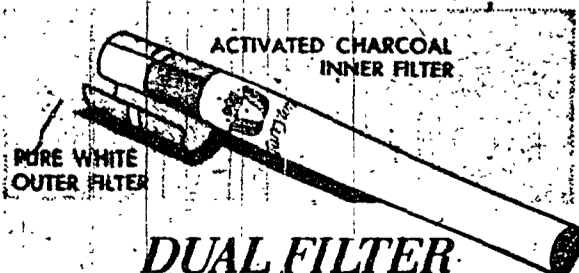
