

Nittanies Romp to Opening Win

man, Robinson and Sieminski were, they were nearly overshadowed by the heroics of jumping Junior Powell, Al Gursky and Pete Liske.

Powell and Gursky each scored two touchdowns and Liske threw for two and ran one over himself.

It was Gursky who scored the Lions' first touchdown on a five-yard pass from Liske at 10:35 of the first period after a fumble had foiled an earlier Lion drive.

The Nittanies boosted the score to 14-0 just three minutes later when Terry Monaghan recovered a fumble on the Navy 32. The Lions tallied in four plays, the clincher coming on an eight-yard end sweep by Kochman.

GURSKY THEN intercepted a Ron Klemick aerial as the second quarter opened, racing 77 yards down the left sideline for the Nittanies' third score. A bad snap ruined Charlie Ricevuto's attempt for his third straight conversion.

John Sai, playing despite a painfully injured ankle, scored Navy's only touchdown on a 35-yard run up the middle of State's otherwise impenetrable defense.

The Lions stormed right back for a touchdown on Liske's 16-yard jaunt around right end. The Lion quarterback danced into the end zone behind a tooth-jarring block by Robinson. Ricevuto converted again and the Nittanies went to the dressing room with a 27-7 lead.

Hardin had so much to tell his team at halftime that the Middies were penalized 15 yards on the second half kickoff for delay of the game.

The third quarter was scoreless as the Lions offered Navy several scoring opportunities, but then closed the door on the helpless Middies.

THE LIONS regained their scoring touch at the outset of the fourth quarter, marching 60 yards for a touchdown that made the score 33-7. The touchdown came on a nine-yard flip from Liske to Powell.

Three plays after the ensuing kickoff, Powell intercepted a Bruce Abel heave and raced 52 yards for the Nittanies final TD.

of the afternoon. A two-point conversion pass from Liske to Robinson made the score 41-7.

Kochman led all the rushers with 59 yards in 13 carries. Fullback Buddy Torris picked up 35 in 10.

Powell had a pass-receiving field day, snaring seven aerials for 81 yards. Kochman had three key catches for 67 yards.

The Nittanies dominated the statistics almost as much as they dominated the scoring.

State had 21 first downs to eight for the Middies. The Lions gained 178 yards rushing and 234 yards passing as Liske and Reddy unit quarterback Ron Coates completed 16 of 23 passes.

Navy was held to 107 yards overground and 125 through the airways.

The difference may have been the Lions' pass defense. The Nittanies intercepted four passes to one for Navy.

The Lions may have paid a heavy price for their win. Team captain and center Joe Galardi and Gursky suffered knee sprains and may not be ready for this week's game with the Air Force Academy.

Ricevuto injured his ankle and is also on the doubtful list for this Saturday's game.
