Injuries to Mantle, Ford and 1961's relief pitching ace, Luis Arnoyo, along with prolonged slumps by others nullified any chances the Yanks might have had for a romp to the championship.

However, they took over the league lead on July 8 and never were headed. Two surprise con-tenders, the Minnesota Twins and the Los Angeles Angels, provided the stiffest challenges. The Angels finally were eliminated last week and the Twins last night.


