

Yankees Clinch 27th AL Pennant

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Yankees clinched their 27th American League pennant last night with an 8-3 victory over the Washington Senators. Star left-hander Whitey Ford pitched the Yankees to the key triumph and another long-time bomber stand-out, Mickey Mantle, sparked the 16-hit attack with four singles.

The Yankees, who began their domination of the American League with their first pennant in 1921, now have won the title three times in a row and 12 times in the last 14 years. Their last two flags have come under Manager Ralph Houk.

NEW YORK was an overwhelming favorite to take the pennant this year but had to battle into the final week of the season before they could clinch. Injuries to Mantle, Ford and 1961's relief pitching ace, Luis Arroyo, along with prolonged slumps by others nullified any chances the Yanks might have had for a romp to the championship.

However, they took over the league lead on July 8 and never were headed. Two surprise contenders, the Minnesota Twins and the Los Angeles Angels, provided the stiffest challenges. The Angels finally were eliminated last week and the Twins last night.

Starting next Wednesday the Yankees will go after their 20th World Series championship against either the National League's Los Angeles Dodgers or San Francisco Giants.

BOSTON (AP) — Frank Malzone drove in three runs behind Bill Monbouquette's five-hit pitching yesterday as the Boston Red Sox defeated Chicago 4-0.

Malzone, bringing his club-lead-

ing RBI total to 94, singled home one run in the opening inning and added two more with a bases-loaded single in Boston's three-run seventh.

Monbo struck out five while winning his 14th game against 13 defeats.

Two of the White Sox hits came in the seventh in the victors' only threat.

DETROIT (AP) — Al Kaline's triple with two out in the ninth drove in two unearned runs and lifted the Detroit Tigers to a 3-2 victory over the Los Angeles Angels yesterday.

The Tigers had led 1-0 on an unearned run until the Angels countered with two runs in the top of the ninth. Tom Satriano's homer started the Angel rally and Albie Pearson tripled and scored on Billy Moran's single.

BILLY BRUTON, the Tigers' centerfielder, collided with Kaline on Pearson's hit, and was carried from the field on a stretcher. Bruton was clipped in the jaw by Kaline's shoulder and knocked unconscious. He was taken to a hospital for X rays after regaining consciousness.

The X rays showed Bruton's jaw was fractured, and trainer Jack Homel said, "It's a bad one." Homel said Bruton will be unable to play for six weeks, which means he'll probably miss the Tigers' post-season trip to Japan.
